In two years, the guerrillas have killed 1,250 persons, including 800 civilians—most of them Chinese—300 policemen and 150 officers and men. The Communists lost 1,100 killed and more than 800 captured.

Contract Bridge

HOLLOW VICTORY

South had the better of a bidding duel in the following hand, but this victory turned to ashes in the play.

North dealer.
North-South vulnerable.

East's dogged "pushing" was logical enough under the vulnerability conditions. West could not be blamed very much for doubling seven notrump, with hearts and diamonds controlled, and with his partner bidding up to seven spades, even as a marked sacrifice effort. Nevertheless, West would have regretted his double if South had played correctly!

West opened the heart king. Dummy won and declarer cashed his five club tricks, discarding the diamond five, and then West played low, put in dummy's queen. From that moment on, South was battling against hopeless odds.

A different, and more realistic, approach to the diamond situation would have rewarded South lavishly! It was not the fact that when he led the diamond five and East played low, he failed to put in dummy's eight—that would have been an action of pure clairvoyance! It was, rather, South's failure to realize that with East marked with an extraordinary number of spades, if either defender had diamonds stopped, it would be West! Thus, the proper first lead in diamonds was his king. Then, with the situation reversed, South would lead the diamond nine, and West would cover with the ten (his best play). Dummy would win, and South would then cash the two spade tricks. At that point, West would be squeezed and would have to give up either the heart queen, promoting South's hearts, or his diamond protection.
