ENGLAND, FRANCE AND THEIR ILLUSIONS.

England is the victim of the strangest and most unfortunate illusion if she believes in the decay of her neighbor. Thirty years of peace, internal tranquility, and prosperity, during which she has steadily looked to her detences, have made France a power to be reckoned with. She scarcely knows it herself, she is ignorant of her own strength, and of the weight of the blows which she has in her power to deal.

But she is equally ignorant of the might of England, and there is nothing in the world so hard to bring home to a Frenchman's mind as the nature of that power. He persists in judging Anglo-Saxon society by his own "Napoleonic" and "centralizing" ideas. He cannot be made to see that all those countries scattered over the surface of the globe can form a whole; and he is always expecting a break-up, and is firmly persuaded that the smallest event might serve to bring it about. He believes on the authority of a few worthy globe-trotters, who, in the words of the Psalmist, have eyes but they see not, and ears but hear not, that the native populations of the different English colonies are oppressed and longing to revolt. Already his prophetic vision sees Ireland, India, Burma, Jamaica, Australia, New Zealand, the Cape, Egypt, Canada, proclaiming their independence, as if that magic word expressed the highest hopes of all those countries. You cannot get it into his head that they are all loyal to England because they are happy under her rule, and because there is something quite wonderful in her power of organization and administration.

So that France is as much a prey as England to illusions about the strength of her neighbor, and if war broke out the result would be a long and murderous struggle, absolutely ruinous to both and with no possible result—in fact, the most foolish and aimless war that was ever waged.—Baron Pierre de Courbertin in the Fortnightly Review.

MRS. KRUGER PROTECTED.

"A staff officer of the Guards brigade visited the Presidency on the 8th inst. A Dutch clergyman who met him informed the officer that Mrs. Kruger was still there, and asked the officer to step up on the porch. Mrs. Kruger, attired in a black silk dress, and wearing a white cap, came out of the house to meet the officer. She was perfectly collected, and exchanged courtesies with the officer, who explained to her that a soldier guard would replace the burgher guard around the Presidency. The latter then placed their pistols and ammunition on the asphalt pavement, near the white lions, and retired."

The cutting of the railway line behind Lord Roberts is a serious matter in a small way. It has probably been done by the Free State Boers, against whom Generals Methuen and Rundle have been operating in the Lindley and Senekal districts and into whose hands the Dublin Yeomanry fell. They are not likely to be in sufficient force to compel Lord Roberts to send a considerable part of his men to fight them. Their work will be more than offset by the clearing of the Boers out of Natal by General Buller, who indicates rather than actually says that he has possession of Laing's Nek and the railway into the Transvaal as well as a road into the Orange River Province.
