Parent Firms May Hamper Subsidiaries On Export Bids

WATERLOO, Ont. (CP)—Canadian subsidiaries of American and British controlled companies should be given greater opportunities to export, H. Duke Scott, general manager, Export Finance Corporation of Canada Ltd., said here.

Mr. Scott and Hugh Aitken, president, Export Credits Insurance Corporation, were speakers at a course in International Business Management being given by Waterloo University College in a series of weekly lectures, and their combined speeches outlined the insurance and finance facilities available to the exporter.

Mr. Scott said Export Finance Corporation is primarily concerned with the export of capital goods and it is natural that the bulk of such exports are destined for developing areas, such as Latin-America.

Manufacture of large capital equipment—such as locomotives, electrical installations, paper mills—could not be completed in days or even months, and no doubt a number of projects now were in process.

"But it seems to me," he added, "that more should have been accomplished in the last year. Why is this? Are we competitive on price and delivery terms? The reason is certainly not that ample funds are not available at rates that I am convinced compare favorably with those in any other country."

"A very large number of our manufacturers of capital equipment are entirely or partly American or British-owned and

it seems to me in view of the excellent financing facilities Canada can provide, a greater effort might be made by Canadian managements of such companies to persuade their parent organizations to afford an opportunity to the Canadian company to tender on large export orders."

The Export Finance Corporation, started in business by the chartered banks last April 1, now has on its books about \$77,000,000, Mr. Scott stated. But this in large part consisted of business previously on the books of the banks or financing of grain to Eastern European countries.

He added that perhaps it is too early to be "dogmatic" on the matter and perhaps some of the business contemplated for the Corporation had moved to the longer-term financing facilities for large amounts provided directly by the government.

The insurance and financing structure outlined by Mr. Aitken and Mr. Scott concerns two broad fields: The insurance of payment for exports up to 85 per cent of any loss; and the financing of the exports so that an exporter may not have to tie up his capital for too long a period.

As outlined by Mr. Aitken the situation may be summarized as follows:

Alberta Rejects Ads For Liquor
EDMONTON (CP)—The Alberta cabinet has rejected a request that liquor advertising be allowed in the province, representatives of the Alberta Weekly Newspapers Association said following a meeting with government officials.

Delegates said Premier Manning told them liquor advertising is a detriment to society and should be eradicated throughout Canada.

But the government said it was not opposed to breweries providing financial support for institutions instead of advertising in newspapers.

The 11-man delegation presented a brief to the cabinet urging more advertising to promote tourism in the province and revision of provincial laws banning liquor advertising.

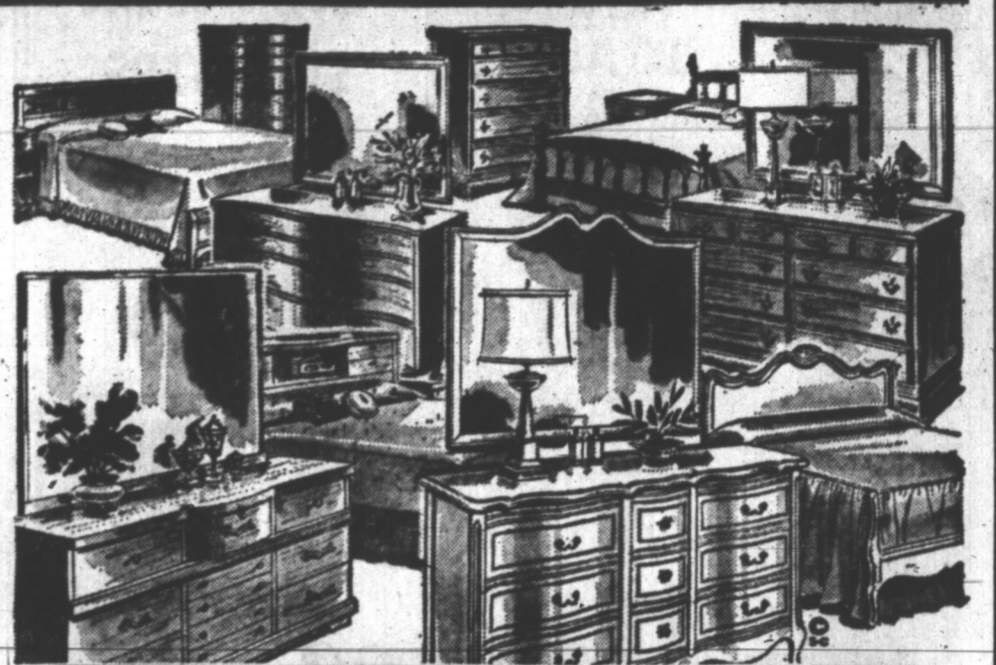

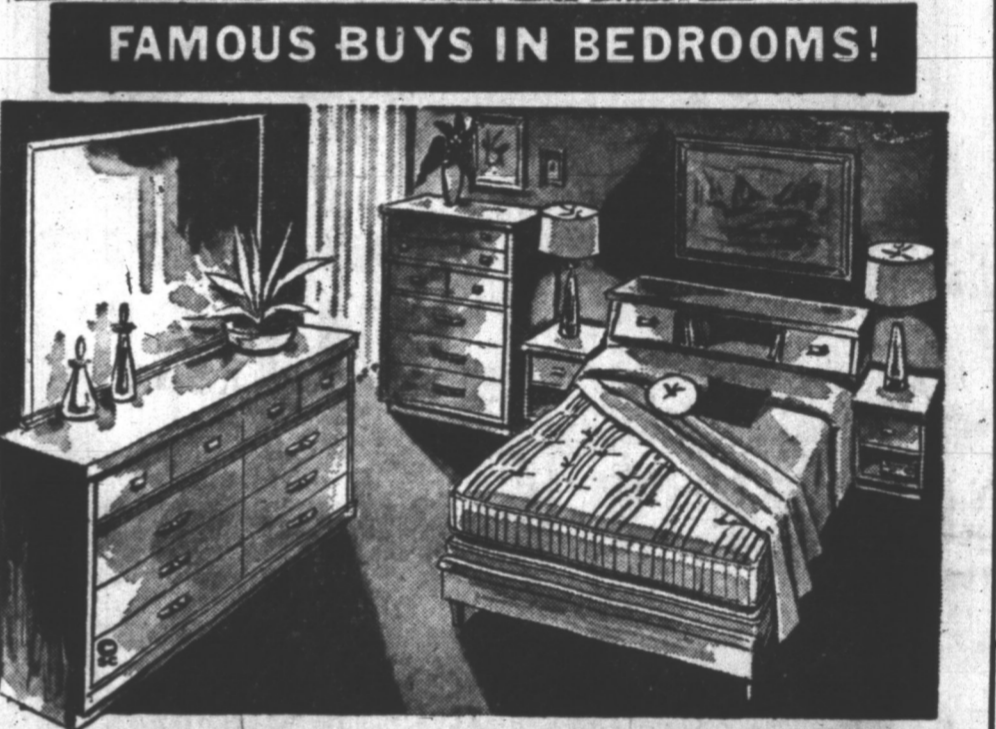
