Hula Hoops Require The Correct Material

The "Hula Hoop" publicity currently widespread in this country has not only created a large demand for the hoops but has, incidentally, drawn attention to the fundamental properties of Rigidex Polyethylene.

As is now well known the "Hula Hoop" is produced from extruded tube which is bent into shape and held together with a wooden plug and metal staples. The prime need was for a material which would stand up to considerable mechanical abuse i.e. one which had more than adequate tensile and impact strength. Another important requirement was a thermoplastic material which could be extruded into 3/4 in. tube sufficiently flexible to be bent into the form of a hoop and yet possess enough rigidity for the hoop to pre-

serve its circular shape without bending or sagging. A further useful qualification was lightness, and here, Rigidex Polyethylene with a density of 0.96, again had obvious advantages over most thermoplastics.

It is not often that a national craze proves anything — other than a good deal of fun — but in the case of the "Hula Hoop" it is interesting to see the properties of one plastics material exploited to the full, both technically, and economically, proving in an amusing way the importance of selecting the correct material for the job in hand.

"Here is an interesting question that was asked by one of the editors at your recent food conference and luncheon in New Jersey" observed the Chef. "It reads: 'Can gourmet meals be prepared on a budget?'"

"How did you answer this Madame?"

"This way Chef: 'Only the best quality foods should be used. Expensive foods are not necessary. Inexpensive kidneys, tripe or chicken livers for instance can be made into gourmet dishes. Chicken tender cuts of lamb and many kinds of fish lobster tails and other sea food can make gourmet dishes too."

"Fine reasonably-priced vegetables can be perfectly cooked seasoned and starched."

"Salads for gourmet dinners should always be made with an olive oil dressing."

"Hot quick breads are not used but heated crisp small yeast rolls are correct."

"Dessert portions should be dainty; coffee served in after-dinner cups."

"Every food should be arranged to make a pretty picture without too much handling of garnish. Presented on a carefully set linen-covered table with candles and restrained decoration a simple gourmet dinner can be a spectacular."

DINNER ON A BUDGET

Consomme with Japanese Garnish
Chicken Livers en Brochette
Broiled Tomatoes
Flaky Saffron Rice
Creole Olive Sauce
Lettuce-Avocado Salad
Pine Nut Dressing
Three-Sherbet
Ginger Parfait
Demitasse

Measurements are level; recipes for 6.

Chicken Livers en Brochette: Blend 2 tbsp. lemon juice 6 tbsp. corn oil 1 tsp. scraped onion and 1/2 tsp. each, powdered thyme and pepper.

Brush lemon juice mixture over 1 1/2 lbs. washed chicken livers. Sift flour over livers to veil surface.

Siring on oiled 12-in. brochettes (skewers) alternating chicken livers and squares of bacon. Broil 6-7 min. 3 in. from source of heat. Turn once and baste with any remaining marinade.

Serve on heated dinner plates. Spoon generous serving of Flaky Saffron Rice on each plate. Follow top; ladle in and over it 1/2 a. Creole Olive Sauce. Place brochette at one side 2 broiled slices tomato opposite. Garnish of cross.
