

### Mayor Gives Resignation

SUMMERSIDE — At a special meeting of the town council here last evening, Acting Mayor George Key, Jr. read a letter from Mayor W. E. Jenkins stating that he had recently been advised by his doctor that it would be necessary for him to forgo his duties as mayor.

The mayor has been on a leave of absence from the first of June. His letter stated that he had hoped to be able to return to office after a month but now found it necessary to tender his resignation.

Acting Mayor Key expressed his surprise as he had expected the mayor back by the first of September. He said that he disliked having to ask for a motion to accept the resignation but he knew that it was what the mayor wanted and needed.

Coun. H. B. Schurman expressed his surprise at the news and stated his regret at seeing the mayor leave office. He then made a motion of acceptance of the resignation.

Coun. Francis Perry said she was sorry to hear that the mayor was resigning and she regretted to have to second the motion.

Coun. Morrison expressed both surprise and regret.

Acting Mayor Key said certain actions will have to be taken by council within the next few days to fill the office of mayor.

### New Zealand Commissioner Tours Island

Hon. Sir Leon Getz, the New Zealand High Commissioner, travelled yesterday to the western part of the Island with Lieut. Gov. W. J. MacDonald.

A former Cabinet minister in his homeland, he was knighted by Queen Elizabeth in 1963 after having spent 17 years of political life. He has been in his present post in this country for the past five months and when he leaves here will travel to Nova Scotia. He is accompanied by Lady Getz.

Sir Leon arrived here Monday and has paid his formal calls on the Lieutenant Governor and Acting Premier M. A. Farmer. The distinguished visitors have also visited Confederation Chamber and the massive Confederation Centre as well as many North Shore areas.

Gilbert A. Beer, a former Islander, died Aug. 28 in St. Petersburg, Florida.

He was the son of the late W. H. Beer of Coleman, P.E.I.

He is survived by his wife, the former Ethel Torbitt of Boston; one daughter, Barbara (Mrs. A. C. Ifeld); and two grandchildren, Richard and Jacques, all of New Mexico, U.S.A.

Also surviving are two sisters, Eva (Mrs. Harry Silliphant), Summerside, and Margaret (Mrs. Smith Mark), North Vancouver, B.C.

He was predeceased by a brother, George, Coleman, and a sister, Mrs. Lewis Dystant, Summerside.

Funeral was held Saturday in St. Petersburg, Florida, with interment in Boston, Mass.

Only four cases were on the docket before Magistrate James B. Johnston in the Queen's County Magistrate's Court yesterday.

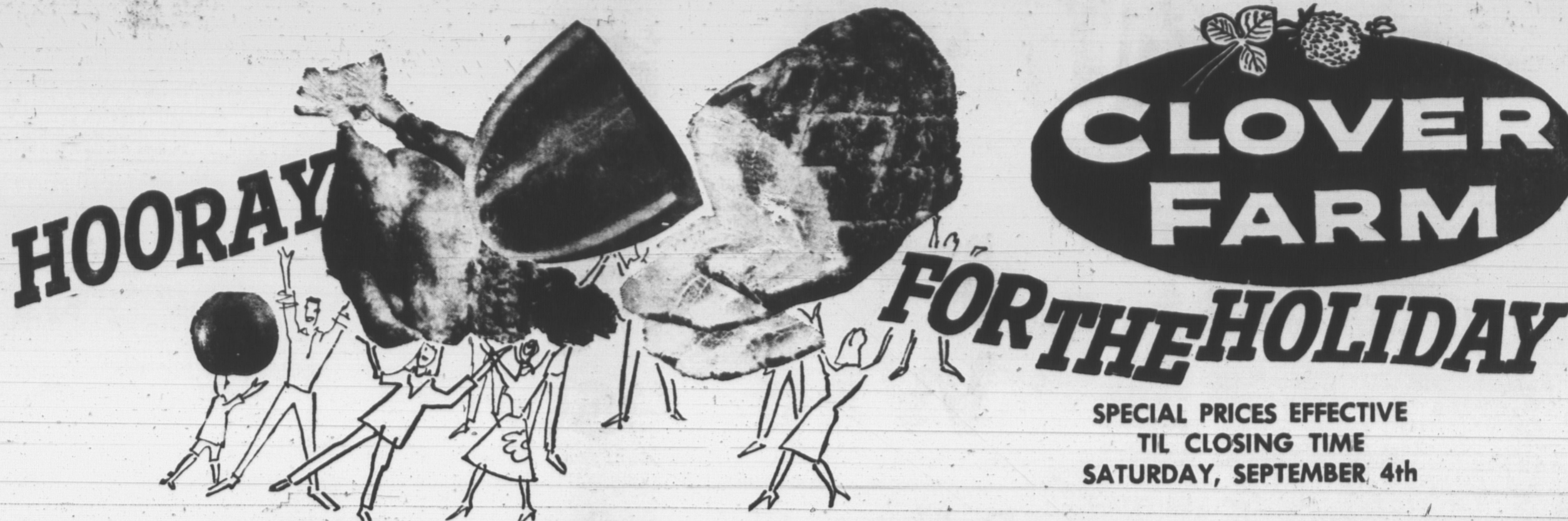
