THIS AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY

George Darrach Saluted; Outstanding Performance

A news page story on Saturday referred to George Darrach, a native of Milo in this province, who has made an outstanding success in developing the Oak Ridges Holstein herd, which established one world and several Canadian records at a dispersal sale earlier this month.

The dispersal sale of the herd owned by R.R. Dennis, Oak Ridges, Ontario realized \$513,775 the highest total receipts ever from a Holstein sale in Canada. Glenafon Nettle Bonheur Maud brought \$42,000, the world's highest price for a dairy cow, and that's really something. It's \$9,000 more than the previous world record.

Maid is an "excellent" cow for conformation and she is carrying the service of ABC Reflection Sovereign, one of the better known bulls of the breed. Her best lactation was 30,202 pounds milk, 953 pounds butterfat and that was for 365 days on three-times-a-day milking. She is in her 11th year.

The owner, Mr. Dennis, is a successful builder and real estate operator in Toronto-Oak Ridges is virtually a suburb. Some of the finest Toronto building projects, and most beautiful apartment complexes have been developed by Mr. Dennis.

Hays Farm International Ltd., which conducted the sale, says in part that Mr. Dennis back in 1958 "decided to dedicate his efforts to develop a Holstein herd that would satisfy his artistic temperament and at the same time prove to be a profitable venture."

GEORGE DARRACH
"The Rosafe herd disposal in 1958," observe the Hays people, "provided the first requirement. George Darrach — he had been in charge of the Rosafe herd — "was free to assume the management of what has since developed into an all-time great herd that has more than satisfied both the artist and the business man."

Continuing the Hays people say "George has proved himself to be one of the top managers in the business, and has also the ability to maintain an excellent staff. Rube and George became a familiar and happy team; wherever good Holsteins were to be found, they were there."

"The first major selection, Bridge Lea Reflection, The Hays people purchased at the 1960 National Holstein sale. That year she became Grand champion at the Royal Winter Fair and was the All-Canadian aged cow. The top-herd building effort had been launched in the right way.

When a suitable candidate was found for the Oak Ridges herd, price was no object, the Hays people relate. Ideas cost \$7,100. But the policy "has paid off handsomely and George has often remarked that his more expensive cows have paid for themselves, and many of them several times over."

As the herd grew, "it has become the mecca of all overseas buyers. As a result Oak Ridges is now an international name, and Oak Ridges bulls are in service in many overseas leading herds, as well as in many leading North American herds and studs," the Hays people report in the colorful catalogue which advertised the animals available.

HERD PROVED PROFITABLE
"Mr. Dennis's requirement that the herd should not only satisfy him as an artist but should also be a profitable venture is more than satisfied. The Hays people said just before the sale. "As a climax to the 1965 show season," the Hays people added, "Oak Ridges won an All-American, five All-Canadian, two Reserve and two Honorable Mentions on 11 nominations. Five of the nominations, including two of the All-Canadians, and the All American are home bred."

"The average of 106 record of

CREDIT TO DARRACH
This rather lengthy reference has been included here because much of the breeding success I believe all of it — can be attributed to George Darrach, the P.E.I. man we knew some years ago — at Falconwood Farm's Holstein herd and later at S.C. Oland's Lindwood Farm Ayrshire herd at Lower Sackville. He's a son of Angus Darrach, Milo.

It's true that Mr. Darrach had the money and the backing of a rich man as he selected the top cows and bulls he wanted for

breeding purposes. But many times in the past men with money have spent a great deal of it in a futile effort to reach the top in developing a herd of cattle. I suggest that George Darrach's ability has enabled

Mr. Dennis to hit the top. And he has made the operation a profitable one, according to the Hays people. Not all of the Oak Ridges herd has been sold. They have retained 25 of the top animals in the herd as a nucleus on which to build another great herd — at least that's the present goal. I understand there are some additional cows in the herd that were not considered a sale's worthy at the time the big sale was held.

It is always a pleasure to salute an Islander who has made good in the toughest competition there is. I cannot think of any tougher competition than that which George Darrach faced as he undertook the job of building a herd that would establish itself as tops among the best job of building a herd that would establish itself as tops among the best Holstein herds this country has to offer.

Common Sense, Versatility Make Firm Insurance Giant

WAWANESA, Man. (CP)—A combination of homespun common sense and versatility has helped Wawanesa Mutual Insurance Co. grow from obscurity to one of the general insurance giants in Canada.

In 1896, the first year of operation, the company reported an earned surplus of \$5.46. Last year, earnings of more than \$1,000,000 brought Wawanesa's earned surplus to nearly \$10,400,000.

The company's head office remains at Wawanesa, a village 125 miles southwest of Winnipeg. Half of Wawanesa's directors are farmers and businessmen living with a 25-mile radius of the town.

Wawanesa's versatility, vital to survival in early years, has served occasionally to give the company a competitive edge.

In early years of operation, the company would issue policies to farmers on the strength of promissory notes. The directors would often use personal collateral to provide cash for claims. In 1900, for example, Wawanesa began the year with an earned surplus of less than \$1,000. Yet paid \$10,000 in claims. Most of the farmers paid their premiums after harvest.

The president of Wawanesa, Milton C. Holden, 63, is a farmer's son and a former school teacher. Mr. Holden, who started selling insurance in 1927, describes his firm as "a company with a small-town approach to business."

HAS BUSINESS APPROACH
"That, plus old-fashioned business sense, keeps us on the right track—we treat policyholders as friends, not statistics."

Mr. Holden's casual nature and homey sense of humor belie the fact that he is president of one of the largest Canadian-owned general insurance companies.

"I'm sure I knew more about the insurance business 30 years ago than I do now," he says.

Wawanesa hasn't yet extended operations into the United States. "We're too busy in Canada to do insurance business in the States," said Mr. Holden.

One innovation — started in Montreal in 1952 — is the offering of clerical jobs to men over 65 years of age. More than 30 of the company's 700 employees across Canada are retired people — ranging from janitors to former bank managers — working for additional earnings or something to do.

Marriages Directive Temporary

LONDON (AP)—Pope Paul's recent directives on mixed marriages between Roman Catholics and non-Catholics are only temporary and will have a prominent position in future talks on church unity, the Archbishop of Canterbury said today.

Dr. Arthur Ramsey, the Anglican primate, told a Canterbury diocesan conference he felt "few very small concessions" had been made to non-Catholic feelings and added that he had made his beliefs known during a recent visit to Pope Paul.

He said non-Catholics felt strongly against the Vatican ruling that children of mixed marriages must be brought up in the Catholic Church and resented the implication that marriages in the Anglican Church were not true marriages.

"I can, however, say that it is not claimed that the instruction (of the Pope) is more than a temporary directive, that it is intended that the question of mixed marriages shall have its place in the future inter-church dialogue, and that meanwhile applications for dispensations can be submitted to the Vatican."

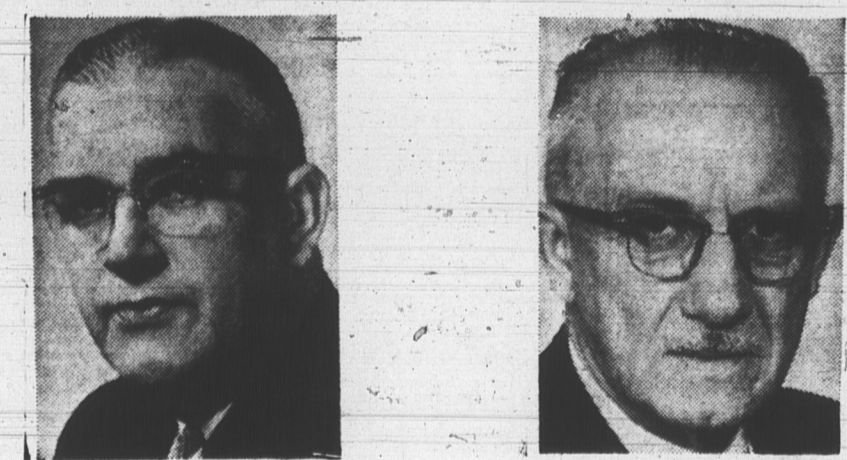

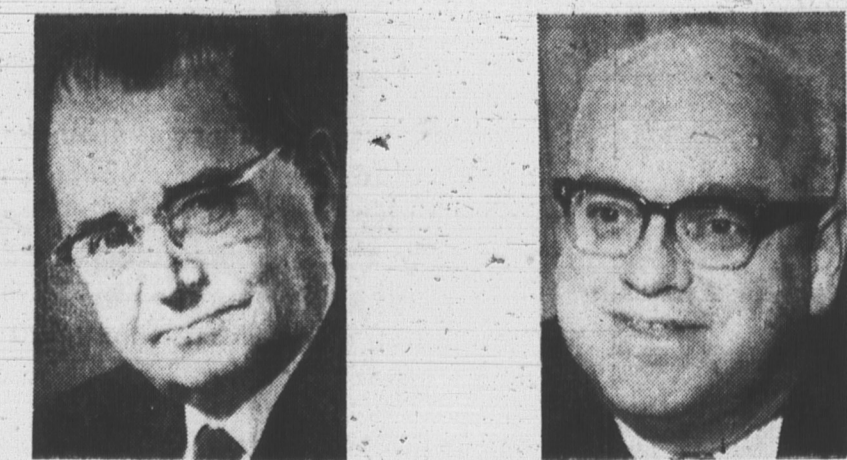
