Air Cushioned Rubber Stamp. A novelty in rubber stamps is the vulcanization of the letters to the cushion, also of rubber, the whole being attached to the wooden part of the stamp.

Interesting Scientific Discovery. Among the most interesting experiments made at the request of the Royal Society were those of Sir D. Salomons and Mr. Pike, and these led to a discovery in the laboratory show that two tubes having a piston at one end and touching along their whole length only at the ends—one of the tubes being of the shape of a dumb-bell—for instance. The experimenters find that a spiral vacuum tube sucks in a "core" tube like a solid does an iron core, and the more the "core" is drawn in, the less luminous the "core" tube appears, the core tube not being connected to the circuit.

Determining Hardness. A new method of determining the hardness or friability of substance was described by Herr August Rössler at a recent meeting of the Vienna Academy. The measurements consist in comparing the losses of weight sustained by the specimen under the action of a rotating wheel with a given weight of polishing material mounted on a metallic or glass base until the material loses its efficiency.

Mask-Respirator for Workmen. The Industrial Association of France has organized a public competition for the production of the best mask-respirator for the exclusion of dust. The instrument should fulfill the following conditions: (1) Effectively protect the mouth and the nose of the artisan against the absorption of dust; (2) should not be frail, but must, nevertheless, be light and handy; (3) should not be expensive, and should be easy to clean and keep in repair; (4) should not heat the face. A prize is offered the respirator which best answers these requirements.

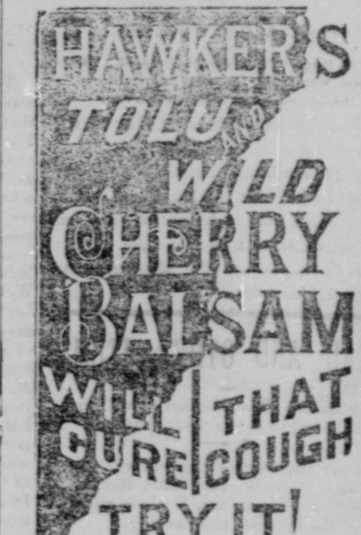

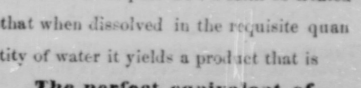
