**NOTES FROM THE CAPITAL.**

A Canadian Vessel Seized.

FRANCO-BRITISH TRADE TREATY.

Langelier Rewarded for His Kick.

OTTAWA, Jan. 15.—Sir Charles Tupper reached here yesterday.

The Canadian Pacific steamer Danube, plying from Victoria to Skagway, has been seized by the United States authorities for an alleged violation of the coasting laws.

The Trade Department has been notified that the Government of Great Britain has ratified a treaty with France respecting Tunis trade. A peculiarity of the convention is that the British Colonies are exempted from the operation of the favored nations clause.

Mr. Langelier has been appointed a Judge in Mr. Justice Jette's place, who has become Lieut. Governor.

**YELLOW FEVER IN JAMAICA.**

Deaths Among the Military.

NEW YORK, Jan. 15.—According to letters from Kingston, Jamaica, the latest victims of yellow fever in that city are Major Slater, a Royal Engineer, who died in camp after an illness of two days, and Captain F. R. White, of the harbor tug Alliance. A number of cases are reported at Uppark camp, where the military are stationed, and where a death occurs nearly every two days.

**A STARTLING STATEMENT.**

Revolution Proposed for Italy.

LONDON, Jan. 15.—The Rome correspondent of the Chronicle, in a startling statement, quotes from an article in the Civiltà Cattolica, which it declares to be directly inspired by the Vatican and the Pope, advocating the establishment of an Italian republic as a solution of a question between the Vatican and Quirinal.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

Boston, Jan. 13.—Driven to desperation over a trivial debt of a dollar and a half for rent, Joseph W. Towle, 53 years old, assaulted a friend who had promised to aid him and was shot and instantly killed. John E. Gordon did the shooting, by his own confession, and is locked up on the charge of murder.

LONDON, Jan. 13.—The morning papers announce that the first battalion of Grenadiers, the premier regiment of Great Britain now at Gibraltar, has been ordered to get in readiness for service in Egypt. Two other battalions are under similar orders. This is evidence of preparations for an important campaign. The commander of the regiment is Lt.-Col. Hatton, and the officers include many members of the aristocracy, among them Lieut. Lord Edward Herbert Cecil, fourth son of Lord Salisbury, and Lieut. Lord John Pankham Joyce Cecil, a brother of the Marquis of Exeter.
