Part-time Profs May Be Dropped!

A resolution proposed by the Faculty of Arts will see the dismissal of some of the University of P.E.I.'s part-time professors. Dean Osmond said in an interview this morning that only those members of the university staff who do not have teaching as part of their contract will be affected.

The university is following suit with many universities who have accepted such resolutions. It has already been a factor in staff strikes at two Canadian universities; the University of Laval and St. Mary's University. The U.P.E.I. resolution has been

passed by the Faculty of Arts but has yet to appear before the senate or Board of Governors.

Dean Osmond stated that the main purposes of the resolutions was to allow each department to decide who it wants as a professor. Although some of the part-time professors are not receiving salaries for their services, Dean Osmond said it would not upset their budget to pay professors to replace them. He went on to say that it would actually make for better accounting and is in line with the appropriate procedures.

When asked for his comment, President Baker, who might be affected, said that having members of the administration teach resulted in closer ties between the students and the administration. He also mentioned that in a study, based on interviews with graduate students, done by Dr. C. Sheffield, it was found that a high percentage of administration members make the best professors. He went on to say that those affected most by the resolution are Mike Hennessey, the registrar, Dennis Clow, in the accounting department and Jim Griffith and Jack Blanchard, members of the administration.

One of the items talked about was the budget for the Photo Club. It was decided that two or three people would be hired on a regular basis and wage. The stipulation was made to look into organizing a club.

There is going to be an increase in student union fees. Our fees have not been raised for the past several years so the increase is due to general inflation. The raise will consist of an additional \$5 on to our present \$40. If we as a stu-
