THE DIFFICULTY IN MAINE, ETC.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Jan. 12th, 1880.

I have talked with a prominent Maine Republican, who has just returned from the field of operations, about the situation there and the probabilities from his standpoint. He claims that the Republicans are certain of finally controlling the State Government, and I shall give as clearly and briefly as possible his idea of the plans and the results anticipated.

Many letters received from Illinois state that John B. Hawley, assistant Secretary of the Treasury here, is widely mentioned for the next Republican nomination for Governor of that State.

I think Congressman Wood's refunding bill is growing in popularity since members have had a chance to examine its features, and to test the public pulse.
