

**IN MEMORIAM**

**MRS. MARGARET E. BROWN**

On Wednesday, November 17, 1954, at 3:35 p.m., Mrs. Margaret E. Brown, widow of the late James E. Brown of Bayside, Lot 14, P.E.I., answered the long-awaited call to Eternity, that came to her in her ninety-sixth year.

Mrs. Brown, the eldest daughter of the late Captain Hugh MacDonald and Cecily MacIntyre, was born in Souris. She was the last surviving grand-niece of the late Peter McIntyre, Bishop of Charlottetown, and the oldest graduate of Notre Dame Academy. After obtaining a Teacher's License at Prince of Wales College, she taught school in Clermont, Lot 18, and in Bayside, Lot 14.

In 1880 she married James Brown, one of the school directors who had employed her. Mr. Brown had purchased a farm with only twenty acres of cleared land upon which he had erected a house. By industry and steady work this happy couple had within the next twenty years cleared and cultivated one hundred acres of the most productive land in that area. Mr. Brown who always enjoyed good health, accepted the many responsibilities falling to one who depends on hired help, and seeing in this the Will of God, she cheerfully and successfully overcame all the obstacles entailed by such circumstances.

Eight children were born of this union. All lived to maturity. Two predeceased her, Maisey, Mrs. D. J. MacLellan, and Raymond J. Brown, a university student. Four sons and two daughters survive to mourn their loss, William F. Brown, M. B., Knight of the Court of St. Elizabeth, Pittsburgh, Pa.; Justin Brown, Building Contractor, Pittsburgh, Pa.; John B. Brown, D.M.D., Boston, Mass.; J. Alphonus Brown on the home-stead at Bayside Lot 14, Anna, F. Mrs. Linus MacDonald, Richmond, P.E.I., and Hattie, Sister St. M. Raymond, C.N.D., Assistant Superior of Notre Dame Academy, Charlottetown.

Mrs. Brown spent the last years of her happy life with Mr. and Mrs. Linus MacDonald. Here she enjoyed all modern conveniences and the loving care and attention of her devoted daughter and son-in-law.

Fortified by the last sacraments of the Church, with her Pastor, Reverend Leonard MacDonald and three members of her family praying at her side, she peacefully closed her eyes upon this world.

The funeral was largely attended. Solemn High Mass was celebrated by Reverend Pius Murnaghan, assisted by Reverend John Kelly as Deacon and Reverend Leonard MacDonald as Sub-Deacon. 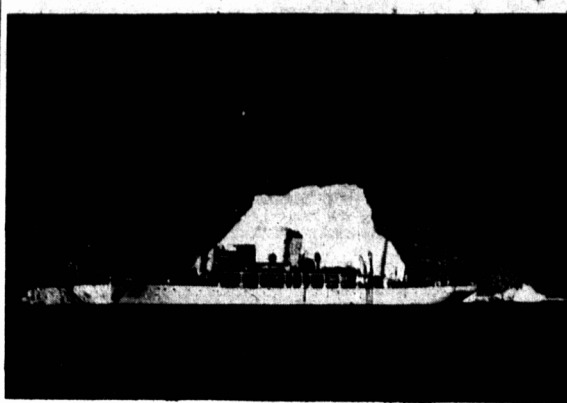
