Effective noon, Thursday, March 31, 1966, all paved roads in the Province of Prince Edward Island, except Trans Canada Highway from Borden to Charlottetown and Charlottetown to Wood Islands on Route 1, and from Albany Corner to Summerside on Route 1A are closed to all vehicles whose loaded weight exceeds 4,000 lbs. gross per axle.
