

### Ocean Travel May Set New Record

MONTREAL, (CP)—Shipping officials here report ocean travel between Canada and Europe at a high level.  
Statistics covering the 1954 passenger list to mid-June show that 92,600 persons have been carried across the Atlantic, compared with 82,700 in the corresponding time last year.  
Immigrant travel, particularly from German, Dutch and British ports, has helped boost the total considerably. Westbound carryings to Canada totalled 64,300 persons compared with only 28,400 eastbound for Europe so far this year.  
Ships operating between New York, St. Lawrence river ports, Europe and the Mediterranean have carried 367,000 passengers so far this year. In the same period last year, the total was 352,000.  
Bookings are reported 15,000 ahead of schedule and indications are the record carrying of 600,000 passengers between the four points will be surpassed this year.  
Rainfall on the Atlantic side of Central America is three times heavier than on the Pacific coast.
