Strange But True

We have read of some nifty ideas to gain special reduction on income tax, but here's a brand new one worth recording.

A southern taxpayer, filing his annual Federal income tax returns, claimed special deduction of \$200 for "depreciation" on his wife. His reason, he later explained to nosy agents of Uncle Sam's Bureau of Internal Revenue: She's so worn out she refuses to get breakfast for me any more.

John Yeo of Auckland, New Zealand, surprised his parents and neighbors, when he started adding inches to his stature after his 26th birthday.

Yeo, an undersized youth at 19, didn't get into his growing stride until he was twenty-five. Then, in one year, he added 4 inches to his height. By the time he'd reached his 30th birthday and stopped growing, he stood 6 feet 8 inches in his stocking feet and weighed a neat 400 pounds!

Larger cows consumed more food but returned \$20 to \$30, extra above feed cost over smaller cows. Certainly kept records reveal that large dairy cows show an extra 700 to 800 pounds of 3.7 per cent milk for each 100 pounds increase in body weight.
