

Indian Director Visits Province

Dr. P.K. Shastri, director for Canada, of the Government of India Tourist Bureau, Toronto, arrived in Charlottetown yesterday for a one-day visit in which time Dr. Shastri will talk with representatives of various travel agencies in the province about his country's tourist facilities.

He is at present on a tour of the Maritime provinces. Speaking on his country's tourist industry, Dr. Shastri said that at the present time the tourist industry is a very vital part of the Indian economy. India, he said, is short of foreign exchange, and the tourist industry he added is one way of bringing the necessary foreign capital into the country.

India's tourist industry, he said, really only got its start in 1952 and since that time great advances have been made, particularly in the facilities available for tourists. India's restaurants, hotels and resorts, he added, are in most cases better than those found in Europe. The hotels, he said offer all the comforts and conveniences of western hotels and the restaurants for the most part feature continental, Indian and Chinese cuisine.

LOW COST
The country, he said, has 85 main tourist centres and visitors are usually quite amazed at the low cost of living. A room in one of the better hotels and three

meals a day will cost the tourist \$3.00 per day, when in North America and most European countries the rate for a comparable room excluding the three meals would be in the vicinity of \$12. The country is also a "shopper paradise" Mr. Shastri added, excusing himself for using such a cliché, and raw silk which sells in Canada for about \$20 per yard can be bought in India for \$5 per yard.

The low cost of living makes a trip to India feasible for anybody in North America planning a trip abroad since the additional money spent on travelling is off-set in about two weeks with the lower cost of accommodation and food.

One feature of India that most visitors find very appealing is that they can choose their own climate, depending on which section of the country they choose to visit. Mountain ski resorts and beach resorts operate all-year round, Dr. Shastri said.

In 1964 Dr. Shastri said 256,000 foreign visitors came to India including about 3,100 Canadians and in addition to this some 400,000 people from Pakistan and Ceylon visited the country.

Dr. Shastri said with his current tour and with additional promotion he hopes to promote India as a possible tourist center for more Canadians each year.

Former Graduate Accepts Position

A former honours graduate of St. Dunstan's University will return to SDU in the fall to head the mathematics department, it was learned last night from Rt. Rev. G.A. Macdonald, president of St. Dunstan's.

J. Ivan Dowling of Charlottetown, who received his Bachelor of Science Degree, magna cum laude, from SDU in 1950, will replace Rev. E.J. Roche as mathematics department head, the SDU president said. Father Roche is in Ottawa on a leave of absence serving full-time as executive director of the Canadian Catholic Education Council.

Mr. Dowling received his early education at Queen Square School, and was the recipient of the Governor-General's Medal when he completed his studies there in 1944. He then attended Prince of Wales College, graduating from there in 1948 and standing first in his class.

After graduating from SDU in 1950, he taught for a year at PWC before continuing his studies at the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Indiana, where he received his Master of Science degree in 1953.

RETURNS HOME
Following his graduation from Notre Dame, he returned to Prince Edward Island and taught for the next three years, from 1953-56, at Prince of Wales. In the summer of 1956 Mr. Dowling taught at HMCS Venture, the naval cadet training establishment at Esquimalt, British Columbia. The following two years, from 1956-58, he was on

the staff of College Militaire Royal de St. Jean in Quebec.

He then returned to PWC as head of the mathematics department, a position he held for five years. For the last three years, Mr. Dowling has taught at Sir George Williams University in Montreal.

During his time at Sir George Williams, he also continued his studies toward his PhD degree at McGill University and taught on a part-time basis at St. Joseph's Teachers' College.

He holds the rank of Lieutenant-Commander in the Royal Canadian Navy Reserve, and is a former member of the Little Theatre Guild in Charlottetown. Mr. Dowling will take up his new duties at SDU in September.
