## LATEST WAR NEWS.

### CANADIAN CASUALTIES.

OTTAWA, May 15.—It is learned at the Militia Department that Private G. Leonard, of the 22nd Oxford Rifles, is dangerously wounded, and Private E. Armstrong, R. C. A., Quebec, slightly wounded.

The Mail and Empire's correspondent, Brown, was wounded in the thigh, but wires that it is not serious.

### BOERS PREPARING FOR THE INEVITABLE.

KROONSTADT, May 15.—Fully two hundred local Boers were hidden in the river banks in order to escape commando duty. These men and others have now surrendered and have taken the oath of allegiance.

Our troops are rapidly concentrating, and it is hoped that the requisite motive power will be here by Wednesday.

Lord Roberts is determined to press the pursuit of the Boers.

It appears that, on Thursday last, Paul Botha and Macdonald, members of the Volksraad, demanded that the chairman should call a meeting and sue for peace, as further resistance was suicidal, and that President Steyn should be made a prisoner.

### A PRETORIA DESPATCH.

PRETORIA, May 12—via Lorenzo Marques May, 14—A war bulletin has been issued here Saturday that the British are advancing against Federals at Helpmaker, and Tonzers Nek.

The Burghers this morning attacked Mafeking.

A telegraphist at Malope says that heavy rifle and cannon fire was heard before six o'clock to-day, and that a Kaffir location was in flames within an hour and was totally destroyed at ten o'clock. He added that everything was quiet.

### BULLER'S GOD WORK.

LONDON, May 15.—General Buller's, turning of the Biggarsburg position was effected by a bold movement.

The Boers had evacuated Helpmaker, but were making a stand on Monday evening at Bisokoplaagte, seven miles from Dundee.

The correspondents on the spot, regarded this as a rear guard action, intended to cover the retreat of the Boer army.

At the same time General Hildyard took Indoba, and it is reported the Boers withdrew in disorder.

General Buller, who seems to be employing his full strength, is expected to push on. His first marches were forty-five miles in three days.

He is thus breaking into British territory which had been administered for six months by Transvaalers as though it were part of their republic, they holding courts and levying taxes.

This success, therefore, has political as well as military consequences.

### DUNDEE OCCUPIED.

LONDON, May 15.—It is officially announced that Dundee has been occupied by the British.

### BOERS CAN'T GO SOUTH.

BRAND'S DRIFT, May 13.—General Buller has completely crushed the attempt of the Boers to come south again, the enemy retiring before the persistent advance of the British forces.

Many Boers were captured or are surrendering. Among them is another of President Steyn's brothers.

Ladybrand is still clear of the Boers. They have evacuated Mequatlings Nek and are now near Lindley.

### BOERS CONCENTRATING.

KROONSTADT, May 15.—It is reported that the whole of the Boer force is concentrating on the Vaal.

The Boers have withdrawn from Biggarsburg and the southern border.

The health of the British troops is excellent.
