indicated that full legal change will not be effective before next Jan. 1, by which time bulk of changes already will be in full effect.

When this legal change takes place, the company will have changed its name in 100 sign countries under its new name. Lesies in Canada likely will be allowed to stand until they expire.

The name Air Canada came into limited use in conjunction with TCA in 1953. Both names have been used simultaneously since 1960. Since that time new routes opened to Zurich and Rome have meant the company has been known in those areas exclusively as Air Canada.

Air Canada says it has no immediate plans to alter personnel uniforms, except for eventual change in hat badges, which will be changed.

Air Canada's fleet of 79 aircraft will be repainted with the new name during regular maintenance and overhaul in October. This alone will take six to eight months.

At the top of the priority list is institutional advertising and create a new corporate image. Low on the list to be changed are such items as bills of lading and inter-office stationery.

A dozen Canadian industrial designers have been invited to Air Canada to submit proposals for a new company logo, design and signature by the end of June. Full approval for the new design is expected by the end of summer.
