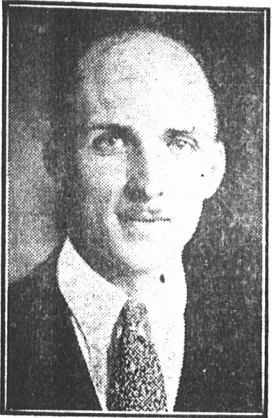

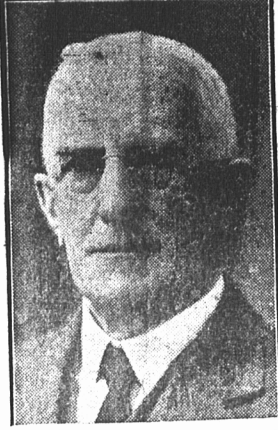
J. O. HYNDMAN

The Prince Edward Island Co-operative Livestock Marketing Board was organized August 4th, 1933, on a rather unpretentious scale, but during its first year's operations it transacted a total volume of business aggregating well over one hundred thousand dollars. Since then it has steadily grown, with a prospect that the present year, ending May 31st, will show a business approaching the half million dollar mark. This record betokens the extent to which faith in the efficacy of co-operative marketing has developed, and the practical reaction on the part of the individual patron to a well founded conviction.
