Cincinnati Reds Hottest Club In National League

CINCINNATI, July 5—(AP)—Cincinnati Reds may not be going any place this late in the season, but currently they are the hottest club in the National League.

Luke Sewell's charges have won 10 out of the last 14 games, to climb over Pittsburgh and out of the loop basement. That's playing at a .714 clip.

The pitchers are beginning to pitch, and the hitters are starting to link their safeties together for runs.

Ewell Blackwell showed his 1947 form in turning back Chicago last Saturday, when he struck out 14 batters. Herm Wehmeier and Howe Fox, big power pitchers with a lot of moxie on the ball, have shown some of the stuff that wins ball games.

Then there is Ted Klussek, big first baseman, now threatening the leaders for runs-batted-in honors. Ted is getting his share of homers. He has batted .382 since June 7, making seven homers and 12 doubles in 37 safeties, and driven in 29 runs. In the last 14 games he made four home runs, seven doubles and knocked in 19 runs.

With big Ted pounding the ball, Johnny Wyrostek, versatile outfielder who has been hitting around .320 all season, is getting some help in the base-producing end of the game. Johnny, incidentally, batted .345 in the last 14 games, with 20 hits, two of them homers. He batted .100 runs.

As things stood today, Sewell's boys were 15 1-2 games out of first place, and 3 1-2 games out of the leadership of the second division.

Sewell is aiming at a higher position in the standing and believes there is a chance the team may make it.

Ezzard Charles Declared Fit

NEW YORK, July 6—(AP)—Ezzard Charles, world heavyweight boxing champion recognized by the National Boxing Association, today was declared fit for further boxing after an examination by the Medical Board of the New York Athletic Commission.

Manager Jake Mintz said the Cincinnati O. batter will fight in about four or five weeks.

A medical board gave the Ohio Negro a good probing today and stated "the bruise of the heart muscle which has kept him inactive during the past few months has completely healed. He is now in condition to resume training immediately."

Charles said he "feels fine" and is ready to take on all comers—"Joe Louis, Lee Savold, anybody."

Mintz said he would make up his mind about Charles' next fight "in the next week or so."

Charles twice postponed meetings with Freddie Beshore of Harrisburg, Pa., in Buffalo. The bout, originally set for Feb. 28, was put off because the champion suffered an injured side. It was reset for March 29 and once more was postponed when Charles was found to be suffering from the heart injury.

Harry Markson, managing director of the International Boxing Club, said he is working on a Charles-Savold fight. Savold won the European and British recognition as world heavyweight champion when he stopped Bruce Woodcock, the British champ, in four rounds June 6.

Chandler Orders Browns To End Talk Of Moving

NEW YORK, July 6—(AP)—Baseball Commissioner A. B. Chandler has ordered St. Louis Browns' officials to stop talking about moving their franchise to a minor league city.

Frank J. (Shag) Shaughnessy, president of the International League, said today that Chandler, acting on his complaint, told Bill DeWitt of the Browns, that talk about moving his club "is hurting attendance in the minor leagues."

"Sure, I protested against DeWitt's actions," stormed Shaughnessy. "Why not? DeWitt had no right to pop off the way he did. All that talk about moving the Browns to Baltimore has cut down attendance considerably in that city. Fans are of the mistaken opinion that the present ownership is blocking a movement to bring big league baseball to Baltimore."

At Cincinnati, Walter Mulbry, St. Louis Club secretary, said Chandler had not issued an "order" to the Browns.

"The Commissioner suggested to the Browns," Mulbry said, "that it would be more appropriate to discuss moving a major league franchise to a minor league city during the off-season than during the championship season."

Sport Briefs

MONTREAL, July 5—(CP)—Johnny Turner of Montreal Hampstead today won the Quebec junior provincial golf title, defeating Brian McGuigan of Montreal Summerles one up on the 20th green. Turner will represent Quebec at the Canadian junior championships July 15 in Saskatoon.

TORONTO, July 5—(CP)—The Ontario Racing Commission today slapped 50-day suspensions on jockeys Charlie Bright and Hugh Campbell. The Commission said Bright was guilty of "unsatisfactory riding and reprehensible conduct" and Campbell of "inconsistent and unsatisfactory riding." No details were given.

ST. LOUIS, July 5—(AP)—St. Louis Browns announced today the club had obtained pitcher Charlie Schanz from Boston Red Sox for the waiver price. The 30-year-old right hander won 22 games for Seattle last year.

HENLEY-ON-THAMES, England, July 5—(CP)—Britain's Ronnie Lutz today ousted the lone United States entrant for the Diamond Sculls, premier event of the annual four-day Royal Henley Regatta. Lutz defeated Tom McCreesh of St. Joseph's College, Philadelphia, by five lengths as the regatta got under way. The title last year was won by Jack Kelley of Philadelphia, who is not defending it.

TORONTO, July 5—(CP)—For the second time in three days the harness racing at Thorncliffe Raceway today featured a daily double pay-off of more than \$600. The combination of Johnny Worthy in the first race and Thor Grattan in the second paid \$652.90 for \$2. On Monday the double paid \$629.50.

LONDON, July 5—(AP)—Some London newspapers reported today Gertrude (Gussie) Moran may soon turn professional. They said she is dicker with Bobby Riggs, promoter of professional tennis tours, over an offer of \$50,000 for the first year. They added Miss Moran—whose lace panties won attention at Wimbledon last year—is holding out for at least \$75,000.

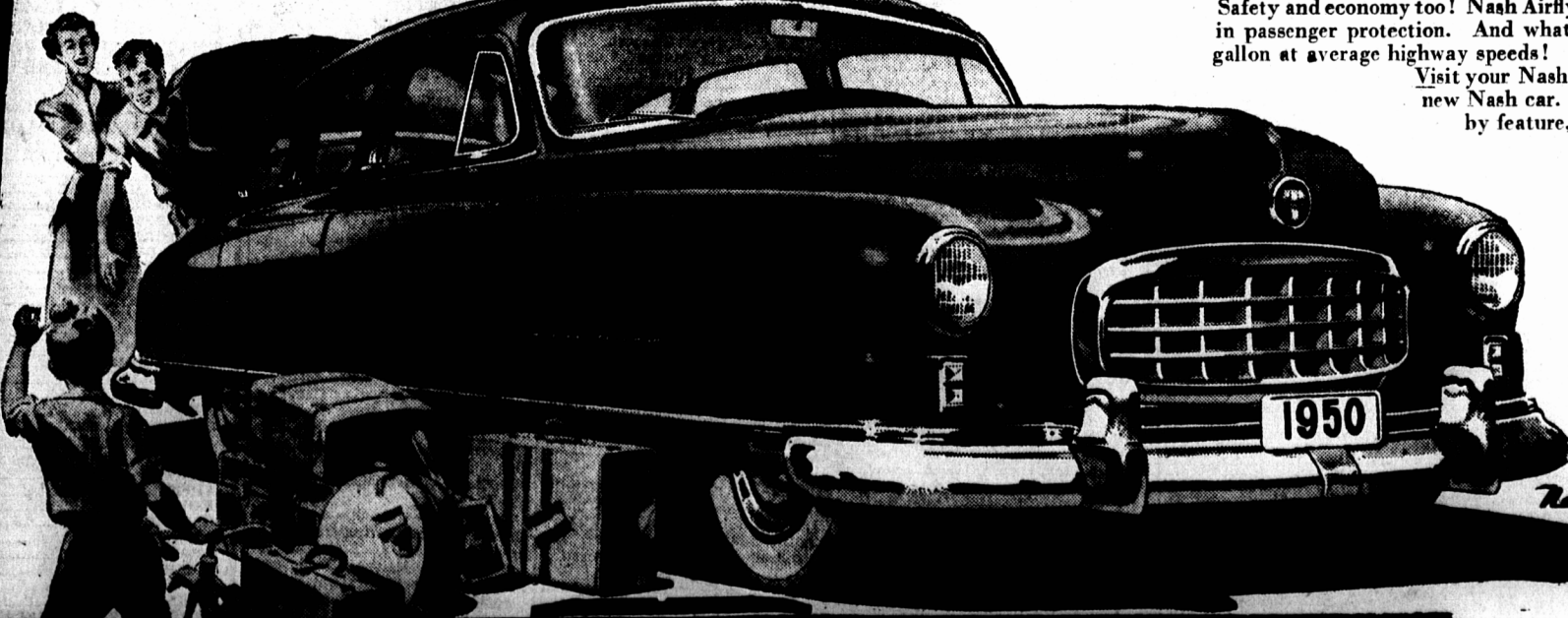
