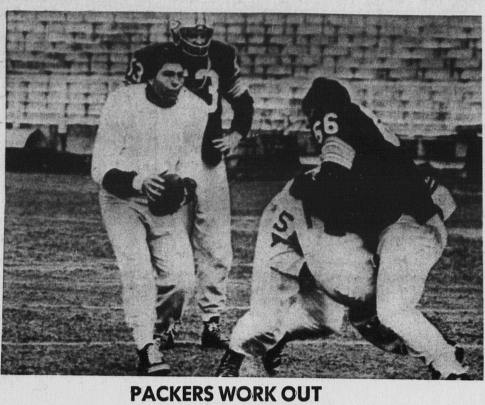

Eddie Slack scored two goals in the Toronto spree and Mahovich became the first NHL player to reach the coveted 20-goal circle this season.
