A GLOWING REPORT.—Hon. John Carling, Minister of Agriculture, has received the following telegram from Prof Saunders, superintendent of the experimental farm, who is at present in the Northwest on a tour of inspection: "INDIAN HEAD, N. W. T., August 19. To Hon. John Carling, London: Have seen crops through central and southern Manitoba, also eastern Assiniboia. Excepting small areas injured by hail, the average is excellent. At Brandon and Indian Head the grain crops are magnificent. Wish you could see them. Large areas are now being cut daily. Splendid ripening weather—bright, warm days and cool nights. The low temperature this month was: Brandon, 34°; Indian Head, 28°."

Ottawa Notes.

OTTAWA, Aug. 24.

Passes over the Intercolonial for Maritime Province fishermen who will attend the Dominion matches were forwarded yesterday.

Government has decided to widen entrance to Kingston Dry Dock, now being constructed to 55 feet so as to enable the largest class of vessels navigating the lakes to gain entrance.

Professor Saunders telegraphs from Manitoba that a slight frost prevailed in the Province on Friday night and that potatoes and other tender vegetables had been touched, but the wheat was little affected. One third of the red flite is already harvested and the remainder too far advanced to be seriously hurt. The Ladoga wheat was harvested a week ago.

A Hamilton deputation interviewed Hon. Mr. Bowell yesterday and protested against fellows of wood for use in the manufacture of carriage wheels being placed on the track. The deputation claims that these articles are being made in Canada at the present time. Flour went up 25 cents a barrel here yesterday.

Stabbed on an Island Vessel.

NEW LONDON, Conn., Aug. 24.

The schooner Avengee struck on Watch Hill Reef this morning, floated without damage, and proceeded. While on the reef a sailor stabbed the mate in the left side during an altercation. The attending physicians are of the opinion that the wound will prove fatal. No arrest was made. The vessel sails from Charlottetown, P. E. I., and is bound there from Perth Amboy.

The Victoria Election.

ST. JOHN, Aug. 24.

The election yesterday to fill the vacancy in the Provincial Legislature for Victoria County, caused by the resignation of Baird, in consequence of a protest against him, resulted in the election of Porter, the Opposition candidate, by a twelfth of a majority.

Strike and its Consequences.

CHICAGO, Aug. 24.

Between 7000 and 8000 men were temporarily thrown out of employment in the stock yards yesterday on account of the strike of engineers and firemen in the railway switching association. If the strike continues until Monday at least 15,000 men will be in idleness.
