MONDAY
Five persons were taken to the Prince County Hospital early yesterday morning as a result of a highway accident which occurred about 2:00 o'clock at Norboro, approximately two miles east of Kennington. The accident involved a late model Buick and a Ford car both of which were proceeding east when the accident took place. The Buick car crashed into the rear of the Ford and both vehicles were badly damaged.

The Buick was driven by Mr. Ralph Wigmore of Graham's Road and the other occupants of the car were Waldron Ferguson, Emerald R. R. 3, Scott MacLeod, Stanley Bridge; Layton Burgoyne, New London and Fred Campbell of Graham's Road.

TUESDAY
Leaving for London, England, on October 25th, Hon. W. E. Darby, Q. C., Attorney General, and Mr. J. O. C. Campbell, Q.C., Deputy Attorney General, will represent this Province before the Imperial Privy Council in what is likely to be the last Canadian legal dispute to go before the British Judicial Committee. The case is an appeal from a ruling of the Supreme Court of Canada, handed down a year ago, dealing with the right to control long-haul truck and bus traffic in this country. Other Provinces represented as appellants will be Ontario, Alberta and New Brunswick.

Mr. P. R. Boyle of Hunter River was elected president of the Second District of Queen's Liberal Association at a well attended meeting held in Kingston Hall last evening.

Rev. T. H. B. Somers, minister of St. James Presbyterian Church, was the guest speaker at the first fall meeting of Trinity Men's As-

socialion held last evening in the social hall of the church. Mr. Somers used as his topic "Limiting the load on your mind" and in a clearly demonstrated talk, went on to show how many people try to load the mind with thoughts which are unnecessary and about which they can do nothing.

WEDNESDAY
The Roman Catholic Clergy of the Diocese of Charlottetown assembled at a luncheon at Charlottetown Hotel yesterday to extend their congratulations and good wishes to two of their fellow clergymen who during the summer had the happiness of celebrating the golden jubilee of their ordination to the Priesthood, Rt. Rev. G. J. McLellan, P.A., V.G., parish priest of Summerside, and Rev. Kenneth C. MacPherson who recently retired from the active ministry.

Monsignor McLellan was ordained at Quebec on May 17th, 1903 and Father MacPherson was ordained at Charlottetown on July 25th of the same year. On these dates this year they were honoured by their parishioners at Summerside and Tracadie.

Mr. Walter G. MacKenzie, Charlottetown was nominated Chancellor and Mr. Frank Myers, M.L.A., of Hampton was nominated Assemblyman to contest the next Provincial election for the Conservative Party at the annual meeting and convention of the Progressive Conservative Association of First Queen's held in Bradabane hall last night. Mr. MacKenzie's nomination was moved by Mr. Walter Coody, Emsvale and seconded by Mr. Bert MacKay, Clinton. Mr. Myers' nomination was moved by Mr. J. P. Carragher, Kelly's Cross and seconded by Mr. Ernest Haslam, Springfield. One other name, that of Mr. Arthur Stewart, Sea View was moved for councillor by Mr. Bennett Deighan, Bradabane and seconded by Mr. Chester MacLeod, Long River. Mr. MacKenzie carried the ballot by a vote of 62 to 15.

THURSDAY
The first session of the Provincial Legislature since Premier A. W. Matheson took over the reins of power from the former Premier, Senator J. Walter Jones, opened yesterday with an absence of the usual pomp and ceremony common to such openings. It was the Fourth Session of the 47th General Assembly, but actually it is a special session called by the Government to deal with important matters which have arisen since the last regular session of the House.

With the president, P. M. McCaull of Ellerslie, presiding the annual meeting of the Prince Edward Island Retail Merchants Association (R.M.A.) was held in the Baptist hall in Summerside yesterday afternoon, followed by a banquet in the evening.

The short special session of the Legislature came to an end late yesterday afternoon at His Honor Lieutenant Governor T. W. L. Prowse gave formal assent to five Bills which had been introduced. He was accompanied by his Naval Aide, Captain J. J. Connolly, V.D. Receiving the Royal assent were: An Act to Authorize the Granting of Loans to Lobster Fishermen to Replace 1953 Storm Trap Losses; An Act to Amend the Trade Union Act, An Act to Amend the Village Service Act, An Act to Amend the Electric Power and Telephone Act, and An Act to Further Amend the Surplus Land Incorporation Act of 1903.
