Seed Crops Drop In Value In 1949

OTTAWA, May 16 — (CP) — Value of Canada's forage seed crops dropped sharply in 1949. The Bureau of Statistics reported today that the entire 1949 value amounted to no more than \$13,228,000, down about \$8,000,000 from the \$21,228,000 estimate for 1948. Value of vegetable seed and field root-seeds also moved lower from \$1,968,000 to \$1,070,000 — down about \$900,000.

Her efforts led to formation in February, 1949, of the All-Pakistan Women's Association, a body now affiliated with the International Alliance of Women and the General Federation of Women's Clubs of America.
