**Rev. T. E. McLennan To Receive Degree From Mt. Allison**

**SACKVILLE, N.B., May 10** — The 25th birthday of the United Church of Canada will be celebrated at this year's Convocation of Mount Allison University on Tuesday next, May 16, it was announced by President W. T. Ross Flemington today.

Honorary degrees of doctor of divinity will be conferred on the president of the Maritime Conference of the Church, Rev. A. A. MacLeod of Whyocomeagh, N.S., and on the immediate past president, Rev. Arthur G. Pentz of Halifax, N.S.

Rev. W. B. Perry of Grand Falls, Nfld., a former president of the Newfoundland Conference, and Rev. T. E. McLennan, minister of St. James United Church, Montreal, formerly of Trinity United Church, Charlottetown, will also receive doctor of divinity degrees. They were among the last graduates in theology from Mount Allison before the Mount Allison Theological College joined the Presbyterian College, Halifax, to become the present Pine Hill Divinity Hall when the United Church was formed.

One nine other doctor of divinity degrees have been conferred by Mount Allison in the last twenty-five years.

Mr. McLennan will deliver the address to the graduates at Convocation.

Two faculty members of the pre-union Mount Allison Theological College will be given honorary degrees of Doctor of Laws: Rev. Dr. W. C. Watson, Halifax, N.S., who came to Mount Allison in 1902 and continued at Pine Hill, and Rev. Dr. F. W. W. DesBarres of Sackville, a graduate of Mount Allison B. A. 1888, who joined the faculty in 1907 and has continued to serve until the present day except for a four-year interruption 1936-40.

The degree of Doctor of Laws will also be conferred on Ira P. Nacna, Halifax, general manager of the Public Service Commission of Halifax, formerly member of the Nova Scotia Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities.

**Reports Progress In Discussion Of Suburban Problem**

The City Council have asked the Board of Trade to go further in their efforts to deal with the suburban area problem, reported Mr. Walter Hyndman at last night's monthly meeting of the Charlottetown Board of Trade. Chairman of a committee which discussed the problem with the City Council yesterday afternoon, Mr. Hyndman said that "after hurdling many barriers, I believe we have secured the consideration of the Council in this matter."

The Board noted that a step in the elimination of fire hazards as advocated in their letter of Jan. 10 had been taken with the appointment of a Fire Marshall. They doubted whether or not he had any more authority than saying what should be done rather than doing anything.

A reply from a letter to the Maritime Commission of Transportation regarding the Wood Islands service stated that satisfactory arrangements had been completed for this year and concrete plans


