My name is Connie Egan and my assistant is Madeline Lannan. We are located in the Robertson Library, Student Services Department (behind the Student Lounge). Our office is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

We are here to help you whether it be looking for part-time, permanent or summer work. We have employers calling us regularly looking for students to work part-time. All our orders are posted on the job

board. If you are looking for part-time work, please fill out a registration card so we can contact you.

Graduating students please register with our office early. Some of the services offered include:

- The on-campus recruitment program which organizes employers' visits to campus by scheduling employers' recruitment dates, posting job information, sending all student applications to employers for pre-screening, and arranging the interview schedules.

- Assisting with application forms, resumé writing and covering letters to employers.

- Preparing sessions (group or individual) for interviews and, when requested, participating in a practice "mock" interview to help polish interview skills.

- Employment counselling.

- Group information sessions on Job Search Techniques.

- Information and application forms on Provincial and Federal Government employment programs.

- Career Information Centre containing corporate information on companies, self-help booklets on resumés and interviews, and career information booklets on various

aspects of the job hunt.

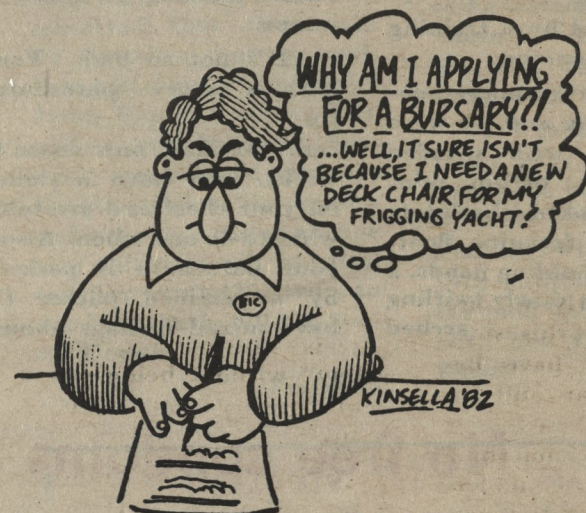
- Labour market occupational and employment information.
