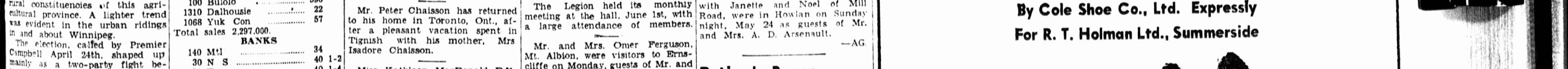
South Korean
