

# Predicts New Drugs To Conquer Cancer

NEW YORK. (AP)—Drugs to conquer cancer are sure to come, Dr. Michael B. Shimkin of San Francisco said Thursday.

He and associates have fired 42 chemical bullets at cancers in hopelessly-ill children, men and women in the last five years.

Some drugs did a little good, but about comparable to snipers trying to halt an advancing army. Yet the promise in the few temporary successes gives the basis for hope.

Dr. Shimkin told the American Cancer Society's annual meeting "We have a tremendous stirring and development in chemicals against cancer which must be crowned with success—whether in 10 or 20 years or when I do not know, not being born a south-sayer."

"Only 10 years ago there were simply no chemical agents which would affect cancers," he said.

"People once went to witch doctors for their headaches. Now we

have aspirin, and we know how it works. The same thing will happen eventually in cancer."

Dr. Shimkin is chief of the laboratory of experimental oncology study of tumors, at the National Institute of Health. Of 492 patients treated, 467 had advanced cancers, apparently hopeless. In last-ditch attempts to save them, they received one or more of 42 different chemical agents that have come from various research laboratories.

By last September, 90 per cent had died. But seven per cent lived for more than five years from the time their cancers were detected, including 80 persons with acute leukemia or blood cancer, usually quickly fatal.
