Blesses New Ships And Sails Them Also

DAVENSBRIDGE, N.S. (CP)—Gregory Pritchard of Davensbridge may be one of the few men able to bless a ship and sail her too.

The Anglican minister of the dual parishes of LaHave and Blue Rocks is frequently asked to bless ships at launchings from a nearby shipyard. He enjoys going aboard for trial runs of the new ships and does so as an expert, after a sea-going career which earned him his mate's and master's certificates.

As a boy in the fishing port of Grimby, England, Mr. Pritchard found the sea irresistible and signed on a fishing boat bound for the White Sea off northern Russia. He later attended a British nautical college and was serving his apprenticeship on a passenger liner when the Second World War broke out.

During the war Mr. Pritchard worked in Arctic regions, taking part in various support missions in the evacuation of France and the invasion of Europe. He saw Canada for the first time during this period, when his ships called at the port of Halifax.

He settled in Nova Scotia in 1946 but returned to the sea in 1950 with ships of the Panama Co. Another turn in his career took him to the western Arctic. During four years there he worked at DEW Line installations and commanded a vessel on Great Bear Lake.

In 1957 Mr. Pritchard returned to Nova Scotia to enroll in theology at King's College, Halifax, but went back to the sea in the summer months until he earned his degree in 1962 and was ordained.

He enjoys life in the maritime parishes of LaHave and Blue Rocks, explaining that many of his parishioners are seafarers and his background helps him to understand their problems.

"Most people who go to sea have a deep awareness of God, as the psalmist recorded, even though they aren't the best church-goers in the world."
