Former Trinity Pastor's Son Will Be Licensed To Preach

Alexander Fraser MacLean, son of Rev. Dr. A.F. MacLean and Mrs. MacLean, will be licensed to preach the gospel this evening by the P.E.I. Presbytery at a public service of worship in Trinity United Church at 7 o'clock.

Mr. MacLean is a son of Dr. MacLean, former Trinity pastor, and Mrs. MacLean, Dr. MacLean is now pastor in the Dominion-Chalmers United Church in Ottawa.

The young man will be ordained to the Christian ministry by the Maritime Conference of the United Church at Sackville next month.

The service this evening will be conducted by Rev. W.A. MacQuarrie, D.D., chairman of the P.E.I. Presbytery. The sermon will be preached by Rev. J.G.E. Ball, of Trinity Church.

Born in Fredericton, N.B., Mr. MacLean attended school there and also in Sydney and Charlottetown. He graduated from

Prince of Wales College in 1968, received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Dalhousie University in 1969 and graduated this spring from Pine Hill Divinity Hall.

He held student pastorates at Baxter's Harbour, Musquodouit Harbour and Selmon river in Nova Scotia. He was married last July to Lila Allen of Wolfville, N.S.

One brother, Rev. Dan MacLean is minister of Strasburg Church in Saskatchewan, Charlottetown, and the other brother, Rev. Hugh, has completed the first year of theological study at Pine Hill. Mr. MacLean is also a member of the Ontario pastor, Rev. Robert Crooks.

Gov't Grader Explains Cattle Terms, Prices

Producers who sell cattle on a live weight basis often hear the terms "brandable cattle", "top medium cattle", "low medium cattle", "fair cattle", "common cattle", and "plain cattle". Producers who sell on a carcass basis to an inspected plant are paid so much a pound carcass weight according to grade, choice, good, standard, commercial 1, utility, 2, commercial 2, utility.

Retired Construction Supt., Harry Corcoran, Dies At 88

Known as one of the Island's most prominent men in the field of construction, Harry Corcoran, passed away at his home 22 Dorchester Street, yesterday afternoon, following a short illness. He was in his 88th year.

Born in Charlottetown, a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Corcoran, he was one of the few remaining students of old St. Patrick's School, which eventually became known as Queen Square School.

In his many years as superintendent of construction, he supervised the erection and complete remodeling of many of the prominent buildings throughout the province.

Among them were Dalton Hall and the Science Building at St. Dunstan's University; Island Telephone Co. building; Holy Redeemer Church, St. Zion Church, Law Courts Building, several of the CNR shops and Falconwood Hospital, also the mother house of the Sisters.

Mr. Corcoran, during the Second World War was general foreman for the local ship repair firm of Bruce Stewart and Company, and supervised its contract with the RCN for the overhauling of corvettes and minesweepers.

He was also one of the original organizers for the grades and labor bodies in Charlottetown, and played a prominent role in the founding of the Labourers' Protective Union here.

Mr. Corcoran will best be remembered as one of the last links in a small chain of builders and mechanics, who were known throughout the province as the "Big Builders".

His wife, the former Mary Gormley of Charlottetown, predeceased him in 1956. Surviving members of the family are a son, Leo J., and two grandchildren, Kevin and Anne, all of Madison, Wisconsin, and a daughter, Hilka at home. Also surviving are two sisters, Annie and Mimi, both of Charlottetown.
