PROHIBITION.

Letter From Hon. Senator Ferguson.

THE PLEBISCITE VOTE AND THE GOVERNMENT'S SHUFFLING.

Duty of all Electors Who Desire the Suppression of the Liquor Traffic to vote in the Affirmative.

The following letter from Hon. Senator Ferguson was received by the Secretary of the Provincial Alliance in reply to a request to speak on the prohibition question:

DEAR SIR, - In reply to your favor of the 31st ult., I would say that I am willing to give my views publicly on the Prohibition question at any meeting held within reasonable distance during the present week, Saturday excepted. I am leaving on Monday next for the St. John exhibition, and will be engaged there and at the Halifax show for the balance of the present month.

I am, as I always have been, in favour of an effective prohibitory law; but I regret that in taking the voice of the people on the subject the Government did not submit the draft of a bill so that the people would know exactly what they were going to get. A prohibitory law without adequate provisions for its enforcement would do no good whatever.

I confess that I have not looked at the taking of the present plebiscite as a very serious way of dealing with this question, but I think that the Government having (unasked by the temperance organizations) declared its intention of taking the voice of the people in this manner, should have unmistakably announced its determination to abide by the result of the vote. Its refusal to make this announcement shows, in my opinion, either a lack of confidence in its own method of testing the views of the people or of respect for the popular verdict, or of sincerity on its own part from beginning to end.

The soundness of the prohibitive principle being fully conceded by the Scott Act and other laws made by the Parliament of Canada, there only remains to be considered the support total prohibition is likely to receive from public sentiment and executive authority. Whatever doubts others may have on these points, the Government can have none, as the verdict is one of its own seeking and it has undoubtedly the power to submit an effective law.

While there is so much that is unassuring in the present submission of the question, I think it the duty of every voter who believes that the total suppression of the liquor traffic would be a blessing to the people of Canada to vote in the affirmative on the 29th.

PECULIAR CASE OF SELEPATH.

Man Sees His Son the Moment he Met Death.

ROME, Sept 6. - A young man named Livio Cibrario, belonging to one of the most ancient families of Turin, while attempting to climb the peak of Roccamelone, in the Maritime Alps, lost his way, and on the following morning a search party found his body, terribly crushed and bruised, at the bottom of a deep crevasse.

Count Cibrario, the unfortunate young man's father, who was at Turin, and knew nothing of his son's expedition to the Roccamelone, on the night of the accident aroused the rest of the family, announcing with tears that Livio was dead. He had seen him distinctly, he said, blood flowing from his battered head, and had heard these words spoken in a voice of terrible anguish:

"Father I slipped down a precipice and broke my head, and I am dead, quite dead."

The other members of the family tried in vain to persuade the poor count that the ghostly vision was nothing but a nightmare, and the bereaved father continued in a state of anxiety bordering upon distraction till the morning, when the official confirmation of the terrible accident reached him.

This case of telepathy, or whatever name may be given to similar phenomena, is considered all the more remarkable, as Count Cibrario is a very quiet, matter-of-fact person, and has never suffered from disorders of the nervous system or dabbled in spirit-lore.

BLINDFOLD THE VICIOUS BULL.

Scarcely a month passes that we do not read of lamentable cases of men being attacked and seriously maimed or killed outright by vicious bulls. It is never safe to trust a bull over a year old to be led without a ring in his nose and a staff. In most cases where they have become dangerous the fit has come upon them suddenly, and after an attack the remark is commonly heard that the bull never showed any disposition to be ugly before. It is often the quiet fellow which suddenly develops into a fiend, so it is well never to take the risk of an attack. If a bull has once shown an inclination to be vicious in the way of attacking a man, it is not safe to lead him even with a staff, for he may quickly snap the staff with his horn or jerk it from the hand of the attendant. Denorning, while it mitigates the danger to some extent, is not a sure cure, as many bulls are just as vicious after the wounds heal, and the operation disfigures a handsome bull. It is not necessary to put him away for this fault, however, if he is a valuable animal and a good breeder (and it is generally the lively fellows that get good stock and transmit force and energy to their progeny), as he may be easily controlled by being blindfolded by the use of a leather helmet formed to cover the forehead and eyes, secured firmly around the horns and by a strong throat latch made to buckle under the cheeks. The eyes may be protected by conical shaped leather goggles, which are firmly fastened in the helmet. The helmet is a complete blinder, and the bull wearing it is subject to his master's hand and may be led quietly wherever desired. The same appliance may be used with complete success in the case of a cow becoming excited and hard to manage when being led or shipped. We have seen the worst cases made tractable by the means of blindfolding. - Farmer's Advocate.
