**In The World**

**of Books**

With Will R. Bird

**PINEY** by Zachary Ball; McClelland and Stewart; 273 pages; \$3.26.  
 Whenever short fiction by Zachary Ball appears in the Saturday Evening Post, I make sure to read it, for I have never seen anything but the best under his name. Often he has young folk in his tales, and in this book his love for boys comes to the top. It is the story of a boy who became a man the hard way, and simply told. It starts with Piney as a stringy-limbed boy of fourteen, proud of Bugler, his hound and a mule and goat; his main possessions. His job is to make a coffin for his father, who is to be executed. The people are kind at the jail, and Piney is sent to relatives he had not known about.

For many years Zachary Ball earned his living by providing music and entertainment with stock shows. In his book he lets his love of music seep into Piney's life. Piney had a mouth harp and from it obtained most of the comfort that reached him. It was lucky for him he could do so for Spang Manley, the man who took him, was about as miserable a specimen of humanity as a writer can imagine. Piney's arrival at the relative's home is painted as poignantly as words can paint, and as the chapters lead on one understands why Ball, who never tried to write until he was forty-six has made such a success of his venture.  
 There is something more than wistful in the existence of Piney at Spang's home. The man was a brute. His wife was a creature who kept thirty-three cats and lived with them in the daytime. His brother was a half-wit more animal than man. Had not another boy, Doff, been another inmate of the home, Piney would have had to leave long before he did. Few readers will put the book down once they have begun, following Piney in his stormy passage of the late teens. Some may term it a story for juveniles, and it is an excellent one, but "Piney" is a book that the average adult will want to read a second time. Love of the land is in it, and the love of dogs. Country life is to the fore. Most of all, there is the mirror of the heart of a boy made strong by his memory of his father. There are not too many boys like Piney, which is a sad thing for the world of today.


