For the convenience of excursionists and others, we publish the following Time Table which has been arranged from official tables:

Trains leave this city for Summerside, Tynish, Alberton, and all points west, at 6.30 a. m., 9.20 a. m., and 4.35 p. m., the first at 6.30 connecting at Summerside with the steamer for Point de Chene.

Trains also leave this city for Georgetown, Souris, and all points east, at 6.45 a. m., and 4 p. m.

Trains arrive in the city daily, from Summerside, Alberton and Tynish, and all points west, at 10.15 a. m., 4.35 p. m., and 8.30 p. m.

From Georgetown, Souris, and all points east, at 10 a. m., and 7.30 p. m.

The steamer "Heather Belle" leaves Orwell Brush Wharf for Charlottetown every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings, at 7 o'clock, calling at China Point and Halliday's Wharves, returning from Charlottetown to Orwell same evening, at 3 o'clock, remaining at Brush Wharf Tuesday and Wednesday nights, and Thursday evening returning to Charlottetown, arriving about 8.30 o'clock p. m., and when tide permits, on one of these days the steamer will run to Vernon River Bridge.

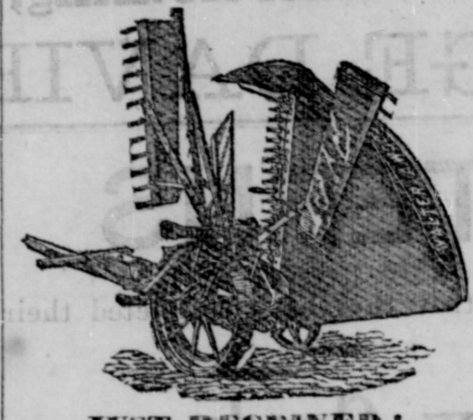

A By-Law to Encourage New Industries in the City of Charlottetown.

BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:

1. All applications for exemption of new industries from taxation shall be made by petition to the Mayor and Council, such petition to be signed by the person, company or corporation presenting the same, and to contain full particulars of the new industry sought to be exempted, the amount of capital proposed to be invested therein, and the amount to be paid yearly for wages, and the tax or taxes from which exemption is sought.

2. Every such petition shall be accompanied by proper proofs that the advertisements required by law have been duly inserted, and no application shall be considered by the Council until after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of the last publication of such advertisement.

3. The Council on such application may exempt such new industries from taxation or from any particular species of taxation.

4. In case such application is contested, the Council may adjourn the hearing thereof from time to time, should they think fit, but not more than one application by any new industry shall be made within the fiscal year.

5. No exemption will be granted to any new industry which does not propose to expend yearly at least the sum of five thousand dollars in wages.

6. Any false statement or suppression of facts contained in any petition so to be presented as aforesaid shall absolutely annul any exemption and the tax shall be collected as if the same had never been made.
