Local and Other Items.

MONEY VOTED.—The Halifax City Council has confirmed its vote of \$50,000 in aid of intercolonial elevator at that port, to which the government has also voted \$75,000. Two Chicago elevator building experts are looking over sites and talking about plans.

A GOOD INCREASE.—The wheat area in Manitoba has reached 1,500,000 acres, an increase of almost 200,000 acres over last year. The total average under crops of all kinds is 2,212,000 acres, which is an increase of more than a quarter of a million acres.

The attendance was good and the proceedings throughout interesting and helpful. The papers read and addresses given were all greatly appreciated.
