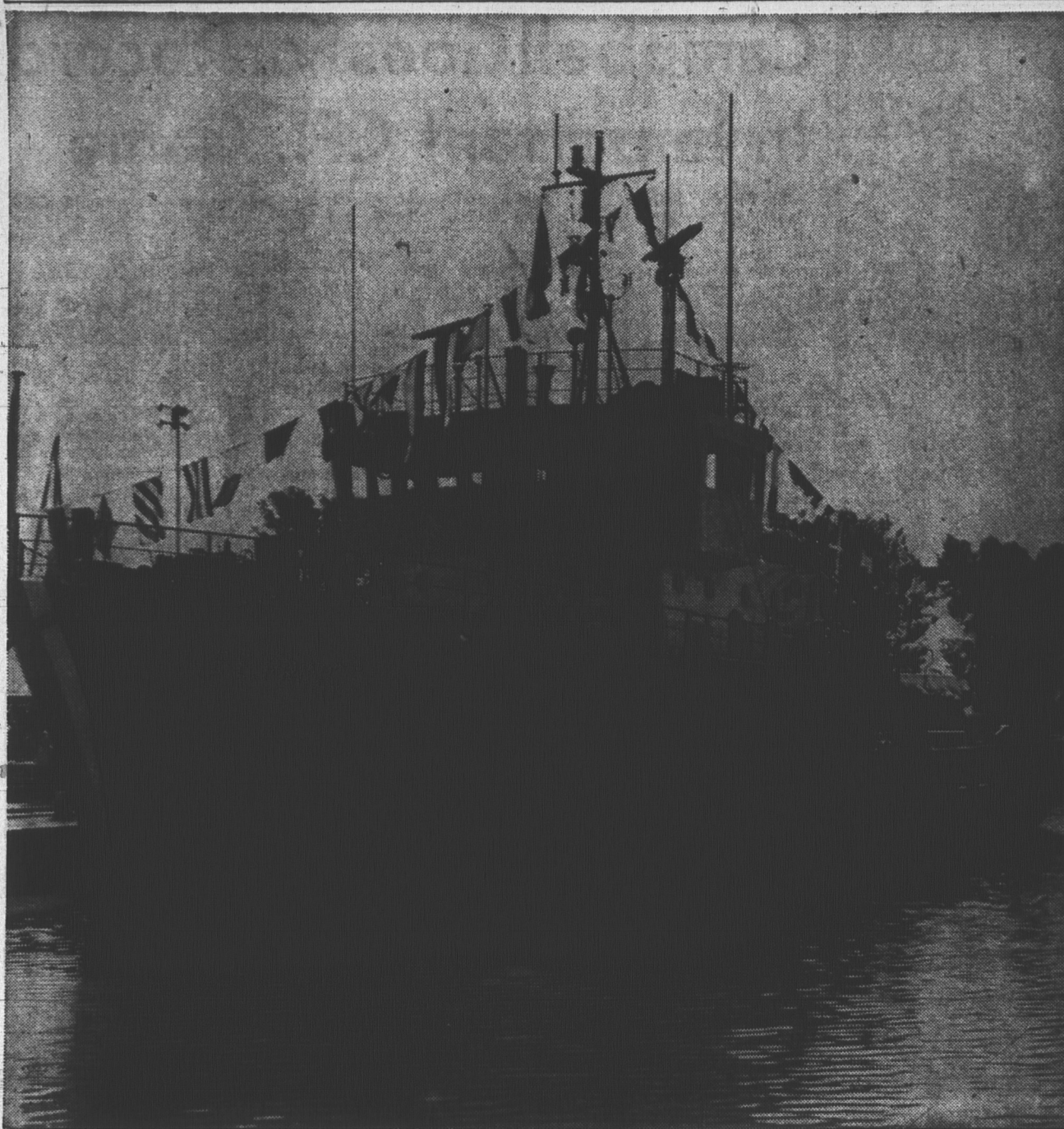
TORONTO (CP) - The Toronto stock market finished the week on a sour note Friday as the industrial index tumbled 34 to 141.76, the lowest it has been since Nov. 13, 1964.

However, there were no signs of panic selling as only 2,498,000 shares were traded compared with 2,767,000 Thursday. Falconbridge slid 2 1/2 to a low of 83 1/2. Trans-Canada Pipe Lines retreated 1 1/2 to 27 1/2. Dominion Textile 1 1/2 to 27 1/2 and Bell Telephone 1/2 to 46 1/2.

Western oils were the only major group to advance. The oil index rose 1 1/2 to 105.54. Home A gained 1 to 20. Hudson's Bay 1/2 to 20 1/2. Scurry Rainbow 1/2 to 19 1/2 and Canadian Superior 1/2 to 22 1/2. On index, golds were off 44 to 171.33, base metals .33 to 87.17 and the TSE .80 to a low of 138.55.

NEWEST MEMBER The E.E. Prince named after a distinguished scientist and fisheries administrator, Professor Edward Ernest Prince, was christened on September 17, at Port Weller Dry Docks Limited, St. Catharines, Ontario. The E.E. Prince is newest member of the Fisheries Research Board and is especially designed and equipped for fisheries investigations on the high seas. Mrs. A.W.H. Needer, wife of Deputy Minister of Fisheries of Canada, christened the vessel which will operate out of St. Andrews, New Brunswick. The vessel is capable of stern trawling at various depths, sloop dragging and longlining and is equipped with ship-board laboratories. She is also equipped with various navigational equipment and a special stabilizing system designed to give stability at sea.

MONTREAL (CP) - The market declined sharply over a broad front Friday on the Montreal Stock Exchange. The composite index, off 1.26 at 134.75, hit its lowest point since March 24, 1964.

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NEW ISSUE POPULAR The municipal market was quiet with interest centered on a new issue of \$1,500,000 City of Halifax, N.S., one-to-20 year 6 1/2-per-cent serial debentures awarded on a net borrowing to the city of 6.90 per cent. The issue is expected to be offered at prices to yield 6.80 per cent.
