Arbitration or War. Smith's Reply to a Delegation. LONDON, March 25.—In reply to a deputation of merchants to the Newfoundland affair which waited on W. H. Smith, to-day, he repudiated any deal on the part of the Government to coerce the people of Newfoundland. The British Government was bound by treaty and when the other party held views as strongly as France did there was no alternative but a definite "excuse" war.

What the Bishops Ask For. QUEBEC, March 25.—Lectures in the form of a collective letter will be shortly issued by the Roman Catholic bishops of Canada relative to the Manitoba school Act. The principle laid down by the Act is that the Government will not pay for the education of the children of the non-Protestant faith.

Formal Demand of Italian Gov't. LONDON, March 25.—The News says the Italian Government maintains that the New Orleans prisoners were entitled to be defended while in prison and that it will demand punishment for the mob leaders and indemnity for the families of the men slain.

Big Families in Quebec.

MONTEBELL, March 25.—Julian H.uson, who was married some months ago to a daughter of the provincial government granted to every family possessing twelve or more children, was granted up to date for his children, that two thousand families have been reported as possessing the required number of boys and girls to entitle them to a slice of the public domain and certificates are constantly reaching the office at Quebec.

The Utopia Disaster.

GIRKALTAR, March 21.—The bodies of 28 adults and three children, victims of Utopia disaster, were interred together in a trench to-day. During the day divers recovered 11 more bodies from the wreck. Captain McKean, of the Elgin, was created yesterday charged with "negligent acts, improper conduct, negligence, mismanagement," and was formally charged this morning before a magistrate. After a short preliminary hearing, he was remanded for further hearing. In addition to the charges already mentioned he is accused of feloniously staying certain persons unknown. Admitted to bail in 2480. One hundred bodies were recovered from the wrecked steamer Utopia to-day. 133 survivors returned to Naples on the Argenta.
