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only to break a tie. That still seems to leave 133 the magic number, but it's not that simple. Authorities hold that Parliamentary tradition requires that the Speaker's so-called "casting vote" must be aimed at allowing the House another opportunity of considering the question. This almost certainly requires him to vote against any non-confidence motion if the count is even since only a negative vote would leave the question open. A vote for the motion would topple the government.

## Union Gas Signs Pipe Lines Deal

TORONTO (CP)—Union Gas Co. of Canada Ltd. has signed a contract with Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Ltd. to buy up to an additional 991,000,000 cubic feet of gas during the next 20 years, it was announced here. The deal is worth up to \$400,000,000. Delivery is to start Nov. 1, 1966. Under contract, Union Gas is to receive up to 25,000,000 feet in the first year, increasing to 34,000,000 cubic feet by the sixth year.

Not only that, but West (Siniscalco, playing with Forquet) made the contract for a score of 550 points. He lost only a heart and a club. Moreover, there was nothing of the defense could do about it.

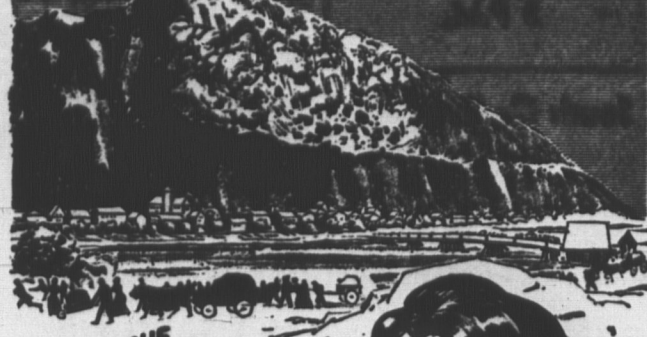
## Alberta Surplus Seen \$45 Million

## CENTENARIAN DIES

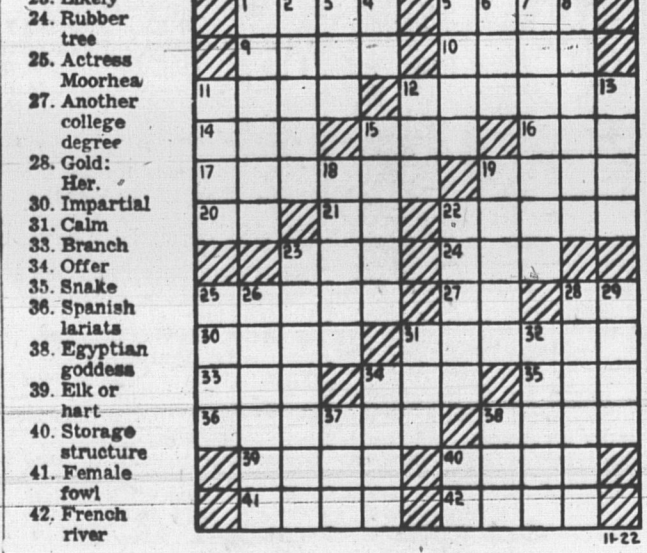
