Queries Future Operation Of Island Ferry Service

OTTAWA — Questions about the future operations of the Prince Edward Island ferry service have been placed on the commons' order paper by Melvin McQuaid, MP for Kings. Mr. McQuaid is asking if the government is actively considering the transfer of the operation of the ferries from the

CNR to the department of transport. He also asks if representations have recently been received from the Government of P.E.I. to have such a transfer made; whether any other groups have made similar representations; and if such representations have been made, how soon action on the matter can be expected. During the Commons' question period Friday, Queen's MP Heath Macquarrie sought assurance from the government that the construction of the Northumberland causeway was not one of the projects which the government was planning for in the light of Finance Minister Mitchell Sharp's speech on inflation Thursday. "The position of the government on the construction of the Northumberland causeway was never changed. We intend to proceed with it and complete it," Mr. Sharp replied.

FIRE KILLS THREE

BARCELONA (Reuters) — Three persons died and 115 were injured Thursday when smoke from burning coaches poured into this Spanish city's Plaza de Espana subway station, choking passengers and causing panic. The fire broke out in a coach parked in a siding adjoining the station, and spread to other parked coaches.

Clinical Course At Summerside

Dr. W.A. Cochran, head of Dalhousie's paediatrics department and of the Children's Hospital in Halifax, will attend a paediatric conference. The final conference — on surgical specialty — will be held on June 3. Guest speakers for the April and June conferences have not yet been named.

- **Make sure you have the correct number.** Checking the Telephone Directory is better than guessing. However, if you cannot find the required number listed, the Information Operator can give you quicker service if you tell her the subscriber's full name and address.
- **Check, circle or underline frequently used numbers** or use the NUMBER FINDER pages at the front of your Directory. Then, important numbers are easy to find next time you need them. Handy Personal Directories are also available FREE OF CHARGE simply by calling the Telephone Business Office.

- **Wait for the DIAL TONE.** If you begin dialing before getting the DIAL TONE your call will not go through. Wait for it—normally only a fraction of a second or more.
- **Dial carefully.** Failure to turn the dial till your finger hits the stop is a common cause of wrong numbers. "Pushing" the dial to hasten its normal speed can also cause misconnections.

- **Use the AREA CODE when calling Long Distance.** When you place your call with the operator, she can complete the call faster if you give her the correct Area Code and the telephone number.
- **Make sure the phone is not "off the hook."** This puts your phone temporarily out of order. All incoming calls are blocked and callers receive a busy signal. You either get a reputation for being long-winded or you cause friends or relatives to worry. You may also miss an important call.
