Gov't says Wage Boost Would Cost \$Million

The province's Industrial Relations Act is being reviewed by officials of the department of welfare and labor to see whether it is fair to professional workers at the two Charlottetown hospitals can be classed as "essential employees" under the provisions of the legislation.

Union locals at the Charlottetown Hospital and the Prince Edward Island Hospital have asked department minister, Hon. Henry Wedge, to conduct a strike vote among union members.

The Industrial Relations Act contains provisions barring strike action by what are referred to as "essential employees." The relevant sections of the Act are now under "active interpretation."

The commission was instructed to determine how much it would cost for a wage increase in all hospitals. A report of the commission study is now in the hands of the cabinet.

While he had not gone into the report fully, Mr. Wedge estimated yesterday that a general wage increase would cost "close to \$1,000,000."

Types of workers in hospitals who are classed as "non-professionals" include kitchen help, maids, orderlies, laundry workers, firemen and maintenance men.
