ReportSport Publisher In Bookie Ring

TORONTO, May 15—(CP)—An anti-gambling squad inspector said Friday that Samuel Roher, racing news publisher and cigar store owner, made up to \$12,500 a month as kingpin of a wire service which fed racing news to bookies. Inspector William Tomlinson of the Provincial Police told the Ontario Legislature's crime committee that Roher was the boss of the service which provided race results to bookmakers in Montreal, Hamilton, Windsor, Ont., and Detroit.

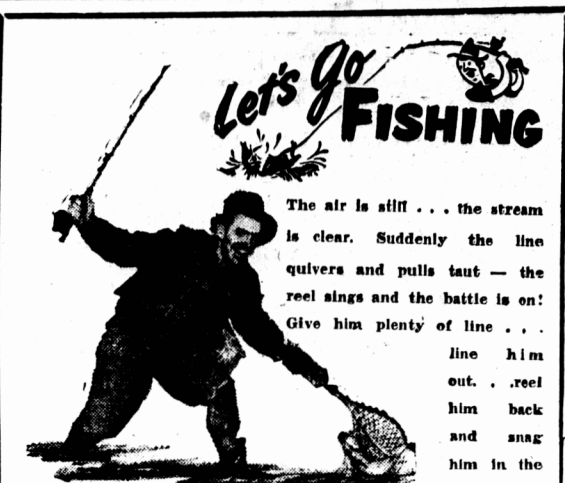
Roher, publisher of the Daily Turf and Sporting News, lives in a fashionable home in Forest Hill in the Toronto area. He also owns a small cigar and tobacco store in downtown Toronto. Tomlinson was the chief witness as the committee dug into operations of bookmakers in its investigation into administration of

criminal justice. He said Roher took in at least \$1,000 a month and as much as \$12,567 in some months last year on the wire service set-up. During today's hearing, Attorney-General Dana Porter said Roher's accounting firm, Glatt and Gordon, will be called to testify. Representatives of both the Canadian National and Canadian Pacific Telegraph Companies and the Bell Telephone Company were asked earlier to appear before the committee. Roher said in an interview today that he has neither asked nor been asked to appear before the committee. "I haven't made up my mind," he said.
