Retired Businessmen Form Consulting Firm

WINNIPEG (CP)— If experience produces success, Blaine and Industrial Consultant of Manitoba Ltd., should soon be a flourishing firm.

The officers are not exclusively men of retirement age. O. W. P. says, "I don't hold with the theory that you're a capable chap until you're 65 and then become no good to anybody."

The vice-president, T. W. is a former railway lawyer. The president, D. A. B. Murray, is a chartered accountant who retired in 1958 as vice-president of the Winnipeg financial house of O. W. Hammond and Nanton Ltd.

The idea came from the Development Board after the board learned of consulting groups of retired executives becoming successful in other cities.

A board-sponsored organizational meeting was held last fall and the company was incorporated Oct. 16.

Cheques Continue Despite Decline In Jobless Fund

OTTAWA (CP)— The downward plunge in the Unemployment Insurance Fund accelerated in February, the fund's balance dropping by \$32,357.81 to a seasonal low of \$38,442,863 at the month's end. It was reported Wednesday.

At the current rate of decline, the fund will be exhausted about the end of this month. There were predictions by reliable sources late last year that the fund would be bankrupt by May or April.

The January drop was \$27,300,000. During February the fund paid out \$58,417,718 in benefits and received \$26,169,868 in revenue.
