FAVOR DAYLIGHT TIME

Councillors Critical Of Mileage Paid By Town

Favor of the adoption of daylight saving time was expressed by several councillors at the regular meeting of the Summerside Town Council last evening.

Councillor W.E. MacCauleand commended the Summerside Board of Trade for their recent endorsement of daylight saving time and for calling on the Provincial Government to make it official in Prince Edward Island.

Councillor Dr. H.E. Clark said that a poll conducted in a large Summerside store indicating that 95 per cent of the personnel favored daylight saving time and that he believed that this was indicative of the general opinion throughout the town.

Councillor Edgar Cannon also expressed his support for the adoption of daylight saving time and indicated favorable acceptance by Islanders.

MILEAGE PAYMENTS

Councillor Leo Wood reported a lack of cooperation among the employees of town departments. He reported that an unnamed employee of the Electric Light Department, using his own car, had charged the town for 17,750 miles in the past year.

Councillor Wood told of meeting with a rude response from employees of the Electric Light Department who refused his request to assist in towing a truck operated by the Street Department.

Councillor Wood said that a lot of people were being paid mileage of ten cents a mile by the town and that some reasonable check should be made on mileage claimed by town employees.

NO GREAT REVELATION

Councillor Clark said that the matter of mileage was no great revelation and had been known to him. He said that it was not as bad as it appeared to be because a lot of travelling had been done on rural extension work and also as a result of the ice storm.

He said that when he was called by citizens in regard to matters of another department, it was his policy to refer them to the councillor who was chairman of that particular department, and he said that if new councillors would adopt this policy it might be a way of getting along better with department employees rather than to make demands on another person's department.
