

# At least 3 accidents Reported in weekend

At least 13 accidents were reported on the roads of Prince Edward Island over the weekend. As far as can be determined, only one fatality resulted.

On Friday night the first accident and the fatality were recorded. Thomas Allan Bell, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Bell, Murray River, was killed when the truck he was driving left the highway and turned over several times. The accident happened about 11.45 p.m. near the top of Bell's Hill, two miles from Montague.

Two passengers in the vehicle were injured and taken to hospital. Lester Atwell, 18, of Guernsey Cove is in the P.E.I. Hospital, and Carleton MacDonald, 17, of Murray Harbour, is in Montague Hospital. Late Friday night or early Saturday morning two cars crashed in Crapaud. Mr. and Mrs. John Levien, Sydney, N.S. were last night reported residing comfortably in the P.E.I. Hospital as a result of the accident, in which their car was severely damaged. The other car was driven by Thomas Gordon Reid of Summerside, who was reported not injured.
