CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

Hand: ♠ 704, ♥ 8888, ♦ KQJ984, ♣ K.

West: ♠ 1089, ♥ 52, ♦ 76, ♣ QJ1084.

East: ♠ 763, ♥ QJ10, ♦ A52, ♣ A952.

SOUTH: ♠ AK5, ♥ AK74, ♦ K78, ♣ 763.

The bidding: South West North East
1 ♠ Pass 2 ♠ Pass
3 NT Pass 3 ♠ Pass

Opening lead—queen of clubs. In suit contracts, declarer's trump management can be a matter of extreme importance. Observe this hand where West led a club which East won with the ace. Noting the club shortage in dummy, East returned the queen of hearts in an effort to reduce dummy's ability to ruff clubs. Declarer took the heart with the ace, ruffed a club in dummy, returned to his hand with a trump, and ruffed another club. He then attacked diamonds, attempting to force out the ace, but East wisely refrained from winning the diamond until the third time the suit was led. As a result, declarer went down.

Bid Made In British Guiana To Have Potato Tariff Cut

GEORGETOWN, British Guiana (CP)—The opposition, backed by the Trades Union Council, is making a concerted bid in the British Guiana legislature to have the government repeal some of the tax increases proposed in the last budget, including an increase of more than 1,000 per cent in the tariff against Canadian potatoes.

Dr. Cheddi Jagan, leftist head of the majority party in the legislature, has said that the tax increases were designed to provide revenue for the development of British Guiana and also to encourage the Guianese people to grow more of their own food.

But in the current debate no one from the government side has answered the opposition criticisms.
