of the General Assembly of this Island,
 made and passed in the Eleventh year of the
 reign of his late Majesty King George the
 Fourth, entitled "An Act for raising a fund by
 an Assessment on Land, for erecting a Govern-
 ment House and other Public Buildings within
 this Island." I do hereby publicly notify the
 Owners, Proprietors, or Occupiers of Lands
 within this Island, for which the Annual As-
 sessment charged thereon by the said Act, of
 Two Shillings lawful money of this Island, for
 every hundred acres contained in the several
 Townships thereof, and in the several Islands
