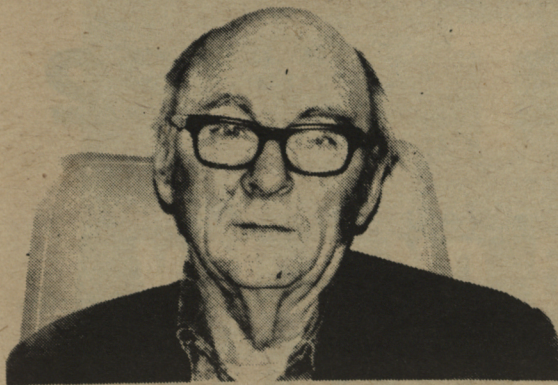


Jock Talk
