### Holiday Death Toll Is Heavy

Traffic accidents across Canada claimed at least 71 lives as the 70-hour Christmas holiday weekend drew to a close late Monday, six more than the maximum predicted by the Canadian Highway Safety Council.

A survey by The Canadian Press from 6 p.m. local times Friday to 9:30 p.m. EST Monday also showed 15 deaths by fire and three drownings, pushing the accidental death toll to 30.

Ontario had 26 dead in traffic accidents and one in a fire to lead the provinces with a total of 27.

Quebec reported 22 fatalities, 18 in traffic and four by fire. Alberta had nine dead in traffic, including seven in one four-vehicle collision near Calgary Friday night. Seven died in Nova Scotia during the weekend, all in traffic accidents.

Manitoba and British Columbia each reported three traffic fatalities, with three more dead by fire in Manitoba and three drowned in B.C. Five died in fires in Newfoundland and one on the highways.

New Brunswick had four traffic deaths, while in both Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan one person died in a fire.

The survey does not include natural or industrial deaths, known slayings or suicides.

# Centennial Year May Pass With No New Constitution

OTTAWA (CP)—The absence of a truly Canadian constitution now appears destined to last throughout the 1967 centennial celebrations.

Nearly 100 years after Queen Victoria gave royal sanction to the British North America Act, Canadian politicians still have not found an acceptable formula to remove the basic document of Confederation from the hands of the British Parliament.

Prime Minister Pearson termed this situation "an increasing source of embarrassment" in 1965, but he indicated no solution is in sight.

He told Howard Grafley (PC - Brome - Missisquoi) that "a great deal" of preparatory work

must be done by the federal government before new constitutional proposals can be announced.

STUDIED BY COMMITTEE

Federal officials said later the long-term preparatory work is being carried out by an inter-departmental committee headed by cabinet secretary Gordon Robertson.

The committee consists of several deputy ministers and other senior officials with special qualifications in the fields of federal-provincial and English-French relations.

The federal officials are awaiting voluminous reports before reaching definite conclusions. Reports are expected in 1967 from the Laurendeau-Dunton royal commission on bilingualism and biculturalism, the Carter royal commission on taxation, the Quebec legislative committee on the constitution and the Ontario advisory committee on Confederation.

DREAM NEARLY REALIZED

The old dream of bringing the BNA Act to Canada and amending it without recourse to Westminster was nearly realized two years ago when a federal-provincial conference approved the Fulton-Favreau formula to amend the constitution in Canada.

However, the formula was denounced for various reasons in Quebec and in Parliament. The Quebec government decided a year ago to shelve it.

The attitude of the Pearson government now is that constitutional reform would be premature at this stage, because of the great flux in English-French relations and because of the Liberals' minority position in Parliament.

Meanwhile, the government is going ahead with legislation that will attempt to define more clearly the federal-provincial division of powers in the fields of taxation, welfare and education.


But it added that any past or future provincial laws would take precedence.

Federal welfare officials are playing it cool, waiting for Quebec Premier Johnson to make the opening move. The province is not expected to pay pension benefits without obtaining an equivalent tax share from Ottawa, which could lead to tough bargaining.

### B.C. Boy And Girl Set Pace In Annual Polar Bear Swim

NANAIMO, B.C. (CP)—A 14-year-old boy and a 12-year-old girl set the pace Monday as 947 enthusiastic bathers splashed and swam in this Vancouver Island city's fourth annual polar bear swim.

Ian Taylor, 14, was crowned endurance champ by converting in the 38-degree water for 67 minutes and 39 seconds. Runner-up Gail Vogan, 12, headed

for a brisk robbery just 30 seconds earlier.

The bathers ranged in age from three-year-old Tracy Shaw to 65-year-old George White.

All who took part received a silver dollar and a banana from the reality firm sponsoring the swim.

The air temperature was 49 degrees as the swim began, and Mayor Pete Malloy did his best to make the water more polar - bearish by dumping a quarter-ton of ice into the bay. The mayor operates a cold storage firm.

The more than 4,000 spectators watched an aquatic display by a scuba diving club, baby dancers gyrate on a stage and players in period costumes and old-fashioned striped swimwear play cricket.

Locally - grown lemons and raspberries were distributed among the spectators.
