

CANADA'S LATEST AIRCRAFT

TORONTO. Caribou, Canada's latest aircraft, made its debut Wednesday in suburban Downsview. The 12-ton transport, designed and built by de Havilland Aircraft of Canada Ltd., had a take of run of less than 300 feet. One of its landings required less than 400 feet. The DHC-4, a twin-engine, high-wing, design is intended for operation from primitive airfields. Cost of a commercial freighter version of the Caribou is estimated at \$495,000. Normal load is 26 fully equipped combat troops or two jeeps. (CP Wirephoto)

More Than 1,500 Merit Prince Swimming Awards

The Summerside Y'S Men's Club, the Kensington Lion's Club and the Borden Home and School Association were among the 24 community groups which sponsored Red Cross water safety courses in Prince County this summer. Well over 1500 young people enrolled in these Red Cross classes and merited awards ranging from beginner to senior swimmers. Many candidates were trained in life saving skills and a good percentage passed Royal Life Saving Society tests. The local water safety committee in each centre took care of all local arrangements. The Provincial Red Cross through the water safety service trained and qualified the instructors who carried on the classes. Malcolm Lodge a Red Cross field supervisor administered the Red Cross and Royal Life Saving Society tests in most of the communities, but in some instances Miss Joan Murphy and Douglas Cudmore tested the swimmers. 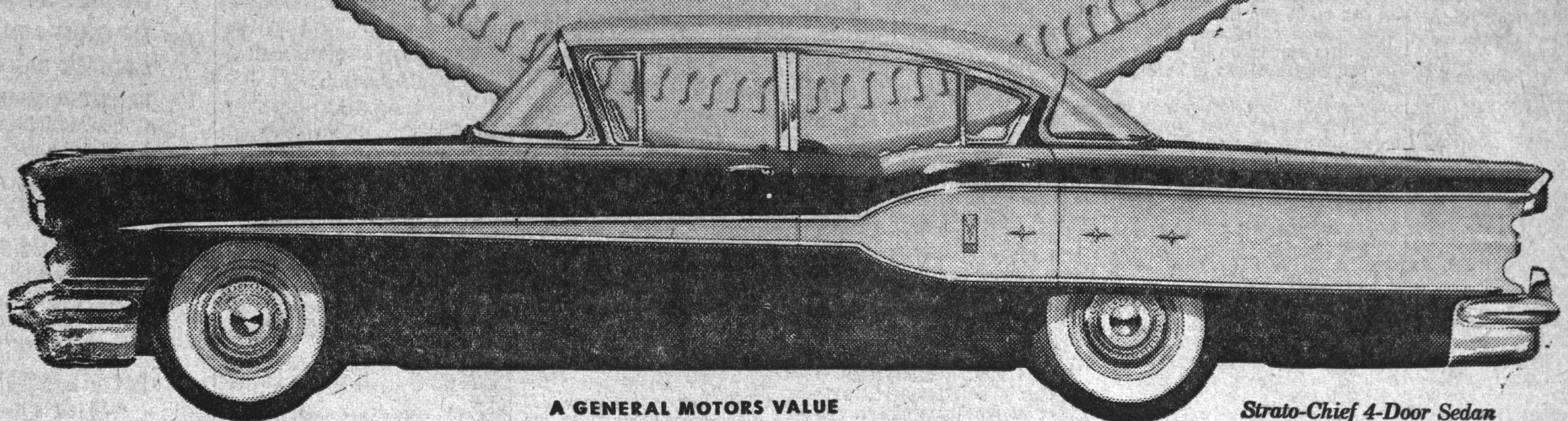
