EUROPE'S NEXT WAR.—The *Pall Mall Gazette* says that the continued concentration of large bodies of troops in the North of Italy, and especially towards the Austrian frontier, is beginning to be viewed with some suspicion in Austria, and to be much commented upon by the Austrian newspapers. The *Gazette* hints at the probability of a war between Italy and Austria but believes that, unless aided by allies, the Italian army would be altogether unable to cope with that of Austria.

STOLEN.—On the night of July 28th, two boats, belonging to John A. McLeod, Kensington, were stolen from New London Harbor by two men named Wallace McKay and Robert McKay. The boats were built in 1878, are 23 feet keel, top painted blue, copper painted bottom, rigged with a mainsail and foresail. The men are twin brothers, remarkably alike, about six feet in height, dark hair and complexion, cleanly shaven and rough looking characters generally. Any information which would lead to their detection, or to the discovery of the boats would be thankfully received by the owner.
