

# Big Rain Money is At Bowie Today

NEW YORK (CP) — For added Paumonok Handicap horses and owners, the big money today is at Bowie, Md., where Kelso, the champ, heads a field of seven in the \$100,000 added John B. Campbell. But when it comes to laying cash on the line it'll be August where the first Saturday of the 1963 season is expected to attract 500,000 fans who'll wager close to \$5,000,000.

The 1-16 miles of the Campbell finds Kelso from Mrs. Richard C. DuPont's Bohemia Stable the odds-on-choice to take his second big stake a week and move into third place on the all-time money winning list.

The six-year-old gelding, who'll pack top weight of 131 pounds, can boost his total bankroll to \$1,219,230. With seven starters the Campbell will have a great value of \$110,500 with \$71,980 earmarked for the winner.

# California Governor To Seek Boxing Ban

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — Gov. Edmund G. Brown said Friday he will seek legislation to abolish boxing in California. The governor said he will ask the legislature to submit a referendum to the voters in 1964 to outlaw the sport.

Brown was aroused by critical brain injuries suffered by Davey Moore in losing his featherweight boxing title in Los Angeles Thursday night. "The Davey Moore fight is in our nation's history," he said. "It is a brutal sport even under the best conditions it can be called a sport," he said.

He said the tide is mounting. He referred to the death in New York in 1962 to Benny (Kid) Park. He noted Alandro Livramento still is in a coma months after suffering ring injuries in Los Angeles.

Brown said that if Moore lives he has almost certainly suffered a permanent injury that will profoundly affect his life. TO STUDY MEASURES Brown also said that he will appoint an emergency committee to survey boxing safety measures that now exist and recommend new provisions until the people act.

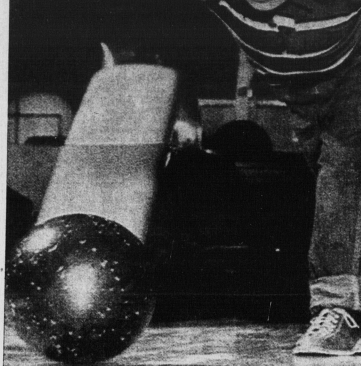
# Boxer's Condition Worsens Slightly

# Canadiens Out To Capture 2nd Spot This Weekend

By THE CANADIAN PRESS Montreal Canadiens, who's long lease on first place in the National Hockey League has expired, will be out to grab the second spot in weekend games against Chicago Black Hawks at home tonight and the Rangers in New York Sunday.

Main thing in their favor as they head into the final weekend of the 76-game schedule is a terrific Chicago tailspin which saw the Black Hawks lose six and the two of their last nine games. Before the slump began Chicago, now tied with the Canadiens in second place, had an eight-point lead over Toronto Maple Leafs who wrapped up their first NHL title since 1949 with a 3-1 tie against the Canadiens Wednesday.

The Canadiens, who had held the title since 1958, have been plagued this season by a mediocre defence and an inability to strike when it counts. In 68 games to date, they have had to settle for 22 ties. "They probably won't be good enough for the Black Hawks' fans this weekend. If they are," said Bower.

By CHARLES MAHER LOS ANGELES (AP) — Boxing had three new world champions Friday but the triumph of the new titleholders was all but obscured by the tragedy that befell one of the champions—featherweight Davey Moore.

Moore lost his title when he was knocked out in the 10th round at Dodger Stadium Thursday night by Cuban referee Sugar Ramos. But the loss could be greater than that. Moore lapsed into unconsciousness after returning to his dressing room and was taken by ambulance to White Memorial Hospital. Doctors said Moore's brain stem was damaged. They said early in the day that his chance of recovering were poor but a bulletin issued at midday said:

"It is encouraging that Davey has held his own through the night. He is responding slightly to painful stimulus." But, the bulletin added that Moore "remains unconscious and in critical condition."

Moore was the second champion to lose his title before a crowd of 26,412 in Thursday's triple championship card. Luis Rodriguez, also a Cuban refugee, won the welterweight title by outpointing Emile Grifflin of New York in the first feature fight.

Roberto Cruz, a 21-year-old Filipino, pulled the biggest surprise of the night and won the vacant junior welterweight title by knocking out Battling Torres of Mexico in the first round of the final feature.

Moore, who held his title four years, had been knocked out only once before in 65 fights—by Carlos Hernandez in 1960 at Caracas, Venezuela.

Moore's manager, Willie Ketchum, said Davey's mouthpiece was broken in the third round and Moore swallowed an excessive amount of blood.

Ramos took Moore's best shots early in the fight, then seized the offensive, scoring repeatedly with his brilliant left. Moore went down and took a mandatory eight-count about halfway through the fight and was virtually defenceless thereafter. At the end of the round Davey was dangling from
