**Boers Retreating in Natal**

(From yesterday's second edition.)  
CAPE TOWN, Nov. 27.—It is reported that General Methuen has captured Haney Nest Kloof, six miles north of Gros Pan, and two million rounds of ammunition.

LONDON, Nov. 27.—A despatch from E-teourt states that a British column of ten thousand men arrived there at ten o'clock, and advanced towards Colenso.

General Buller has established his headquarters at Willow Grange Station. The Boers are now in full retreat to Frere Station.

LONDON, Nov. 27.—A despatch to The Daily Mail says that the New Zealand contingent has been sent to Green Point to await the arrival of the Canadian South African contingent, when the two contingents will march through the town together.

There will be an official welcome in Cape Town in front of the town hall, and a formal address will be presented to them.

In striking contrast we see all the leading Quebec Conservatives, boldly announcing wherever they go their unswerving loyalty to the Queen and the Empire. Not one discordant note in the Conservative camp,—while shouts of disloyalty and cheers for the Boers come from the grit wigwam!

Mr Editor, the enemies of Canada are more wily than the Boers in one respect. But election day is not far away, and when it comes, the grit government mob will be crushed by the mighty force of the wrath of an insulted and outraged electorate, like an egg shell 'neath the wheels of a huge locomotive.
